SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- 1.) 1/6/15 – The Commissioner's Report for December 2014 and the 4th Quarter Greenwood Billing Report were completed and submitted.
- 2.) 1/7/15 – Two CO inspections were performed. One was Champions Drive and the other on Harlequin Loop.
- 3.) 1/7/15 – The 4.04 report was completed and submitted to DNREC. This report provides detailed information about operators who work at the treatment plant and is required to be submitted annually by the NPDES permit.
- 4.) 1/14/15 – Wastewater staff assisted with shoveling and salting sidewalks, including Town Hall.
- 5.) 1/21/15 – Super. Collins attended a meeting at Town Hall with Jason Loar from DBF and Town Manager Savage pertaining to wastewater issues.
- 6.) 1/26/15 – The Spray Effluent monitoring Report (SEMR) for December 2015 and the 2015 Spray Annual Report were completed and submitted to DNREC. Both reports are required by the Spray Irrigation permit.
- 7.) 1/28/15 – Super. Collins set up a meeting with Mr. Struass from the Drainage Section of DNREC for early February. The objective of this meeting is for the Town to get a overview of the Tax Ditch Restoration project currently being undertaken by the State of Delaware to rehabilitate the section of tax ditch that lies between N. Cannon St. and N. Main St.
