### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- 1.) 7/6/16 – Super. Collins and Code Enforcement Officer Butler went to Pict-Sweet to investigate odor issues.
- 2.) 7/11/16 – Super. Collins inspected the sewer portions of the roads up for acceptance in Heritage Shores. Several out-of-spec manhole lids were found.
- 3.) 7/12/16 – WWTF staff assisted with the installation of some of the Economical Development banners along Market Street.
- 4.) 7/13/16 – Repairs began on the “A” side baffle walls of the RBC platform. Repairs to the broken bearing on RBC A4 also began. Also, the E-DMR and DMR for June 2016 were submitted electronically.
- 5.) 7/14/16 – WWTF staff assisted Jerry Butler with weed spraying on several streets.
- 6.) 7/18/16 – A sewer complaint was received from 412 Walnut. It was subsequently determined that the issue was the homeowner’s responsibility.
- 7.) 7/21/16 – Super. Collins assisted the Water Dept. with inspecting all valves and hydrants on the roads up for acceptance in Heritage Shores.
- 8.) 7/26/16 – The SEMR for June 2016 was submitted.
- 9.) 7/28/16 – 3.5 inches of rain fell, causing numerous issues at the WWTF. Flow for this day was 669,000 gallons.
