



October 2015 Town Report

Economic Outlook:

The Town collected \$4,148.68 in building permit fees during the month of August. There was on (1) building permit issued for new construction. The Town also received a check from the Recorder of Deeds in the amount of \$39,119.28 for property transfer taxes collected on our behalf.

Apple Scrapple:

This year's event took place on October 9th and 10th. The Commissioners and I took part in the opening ceremonies held on that Friday. This year's attendance was up and the weather was a little more cooperative when compared to the most recent years. Many thanks to the festival committee for their hard work and dedication to this very important fundraising event.

Dollar General:

Construction is progressing as scheduled on the new Dollar General. The outside of the building has been completed, as has the sewer main replacement along Johns Street. Paving of the parking lot and the patching of the alley will finish up in November. An open date has not yet been scheduled.

Town Hall Maintenance:

The gutters at Town Hall were replaced. Bids were received to power wash the building in November. Attempts will also be made to remove the white stains on the south side of the building. The sign on the west side of the building is also beginning to come off. It appears that new anchors may be needed. This will hopefully be addressed in November as well.

2015 Bridgeville Charity Open:

The tournament was a success, bringing in over \$24,000. We had some new sponsors and some new players this year which was exciting. A final contribution amount will be determined once all invoices have been received.

DLLG Legislative Advisory Committee:

I attended the LAC meeting held on 10/29. The hope is to get out in front of the issues that popped up at the end of the last fiscal year (street aid, gas tax, transfer tax reduction, etc.). We hope to attend the various cabinet meetings, as well as meet with the Governor prior to the beginning of the upcoming legislative session.

Garbage Contract:

Peninsula Oil was the winning bidder on the contract. They will begin offering the service for \$14.75 as of November 1st for curb side garbage pick-up. Notices regarding the change in service providers for the Town contract were mailed, emailed, posted at Town Hall, posted on Facebook, posted on the Town website and even hand delivered.

Regular daily activities and duties were completed throughout the month, and weekly department meetings were held.
