From the President's Desk

The Bridgeville Town Commission adopted the Fiscal 2007 budget in June. We are pleased to announce that this budget will reduce our tax rate from \$1.83 per hundred dollars of assessed value to \$1.73. This 5% reduction in property taxes is the direct result of the growth of our tax base and marks the second time the Commission has reduced the tax burden of the people of Bridgeville. Controlled growth that is required to pay its own way is the hallmark of the Bridgeville financial picture. Look elsewhere in this newsletter for more particulars of the Fiscal 2007 budget.

We all are aware of the disturbing events in Seaford surrounding the funerals of two American Heroes. Your Commission is determined that these events will not be repeated in our Town. Towards that end we have introduced an ordinance to "Ensure the Peace, Safety and Good Order of the Town." We are confident that our attorneys have created an ordinance that will pass constitutional muster. This ordinance requires a protest or demonstration to obtain a Town permit at least 15 business days prior to the planned event. There is a fee required for the permit and a fee to cover any expenses the Town would incur in providing security on that date. We can also direct the protest to a section of the Town at least 1,000 feet from any lawful assemblies, religious services, memorial services, funerals or other community events. We believe the fenced area adjacent to our sewer plant would provide adequate security. We would rather not permit the type of disturbing protest that occurred in Seaford, but free speech requirements do not allow us such liberty. What a shame.

The Bridgeville Planning Commission, after a public hearing on May 30, 2006, has recommended the adoption of an amended Comprehensive Plan. This amended plan has been submitted to the Office of State Planning Coordination for their comments. The State has the right to comment but cannot stop the Town from adopting a plan supported by our people. Once the State has had the opportunity to review this plan, the Commission will hold its own public hearing. After that public hearing the Commission will act on the updated plan.

I have heard some comments about the proposed new Bridgeville Library. Under State law the Bridgeville Library Trustees, a completely independent board, has the legal responsibility and authority to build this facility. The Town has attempted to provide the funding for this construction. Heritage Shores Special Tax District bonds have been sold for \$700,000 and will be used for library construction. These bonds will be repaid by special taxes on this development and are not an obligation of the Town of Bridgeville. Additionally, every building permit issued for Heritage Shores provides \$100.00 that can be used for construction (\$200,000 will be realized). The donated land for this building, valued at \$200,000, has already been set aside.

This 1.1 million dollars for library funding is available but remains under the Commission's control. It is now up to the Library Trustees to build this facility. President Matt Davis reports the Library Trustees continue to pursue matching funds from the State that will enable them to go forward with their plans. We look forward to the Trustees' success in this endeavor.

Minutes from the Monthly Commission Meetings

April 10, 2006

Traffic arrests for March were 281; Criminal arrests for March were 52.

Thirty-one building permits were issued in March bringing revenue of \$17,260.00.

Demolition was completed at 109 N. Cannon St. and a new home begun. Fire destroyed a home at 112 First St.

Street signs were repaired and replaced.

Trimmed branches were chipped for mulch to be used throughout Town.

Twenty water meters were installed and fourteen water/ sewer inspections were completed at Heritage Shores.

Building has begun on the new Town water tower located on Wilson Farm Rd.

A new raw influent pump was put into service at the Wastewater Treatment Plant .

The Town instituted a yearly permit procedure for food handling businesses, requiring the proper disposal of fats, oils and grease for the safety of our sewer system.

Field work evaluations were conducted at the Wastewater Treatment Plant for the upcoming Tatman Spray Irrigation project.

The Town and Police Department were honored at an Appreciation Dinner hosted by Lifeway Church of God on April 8th.

Sussex County Councilman Finley Jones presented the Commissioners with a \$2,000.00 grant from the Sussex County Council to assist the Town in the expense of updating its Comprehensive Plan.

The Town Manager and Finance Director are researching ways to control Town electric costs due to the impending rate hike.

The Commissioners signed a lease agreement with Wheatley Farms regarding approximately 900 acres to be used for spray irrigation.

A Moderately Priced Housing Program was adopted, allowing Bridgeville residents and workers to receive priority status in buying new homes in future Town developments with a fixed rate of no more than \$225,000.00.

The Town has been approved to receive RBC loan funding from the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control. This will allow Bridgeville to replace vital equipment at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

May 8, 2006

Traffic arrests for April were 251; Criminal arrests for April were 40.

Nine building permits were issued in April bringing revenue of \$5,474.00.

Fire damaged properties at 112 First St. and 27 Gum St. have been referred to the county for demolition.

A new street sign was installed on Mechanic St.

Twenty-four water meters were installed and nine water/ sewer inspections were completed at Heritage Shores. Meters installed now total 215.

The new Town water tower is being painted.

Manhole inspections took place at Heritage Shores and a final inspection was conducted of the new sewer force main connecting the Gateway Plaza pump station to the Heritage Shores pump station.

A fire was reported at the Little League field destroying the concession stand and announcing booth. Steps are being taken to re-establish services at the site.

The Commissioners conducted a Budget Workshop preparing the FY-07 budget for adoption in early June.

The National Arbor Day Foundation has named Bridgeville as a 2005 Tree City USA. Commissioners Correll and Sipple have been instrumental in Town tree planting.

It was reported the Bridgeville Police Department assisted the Delaware State Police 16 times in April and well over 100 times during 2006.

The Police Department will receive a grant from the Department of Highway Safety to participate in the "Click It or Ticket" program.

Senator Adams and Representative Ewing have been asked to introduce legislation allowing police officers who are certified in other states to be hired in Delaware with minimal additional training. Currently, all potential police officers must receive full Delaware police training in spite of previous experience.

Legislation has been proposed in Dover to standardize elections in all Delaware municipalities.

The Commission clarified a building permit is required for any improvement to a structure in Town, with the exception of replacement only of roof shingles.

Minutes from the Monthly Commission Meetings

June 12, 2006

Traffic arrests for May were 265; Criminal arrests for May were 49.

Thirty-two building permits were issued in May bringing revenue of \$21,491.00.

A demolition permit was issued for 38 Church St.

Letters were sent to residents requesting tree trimming to allow height clearance for the new street sweeper, which arrived on May 17th.

Potholes were filled and storm drains were cleaned throughout Town.

Eight water meters were installed and fourteen sewer/ water inspections were completed at Heritage Shores.

Consumer Confidence Reports concerning Town water quality were mailed to all homeowners.

This is the 92nd consecutive month without a NPDES violation at the Wastewater Treatment facility.

A new air compressor was installed at the Wastewater Treatment Plant replacing an 18-year old, less efficient model. A Rotating Biological Contactor gear-box was also replaced, after over 150,000 hours of use.

The Commissioners presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Ralph L. Scott, III and Scott's Furniture, Inc. for their generous donation of furniture for the lobby at Town Hall.

The Town Solicitor has requested a court date to order demolition of the house at 102 N. Main St.

The Commissioners made a memorial gift to the Nanticoke Senior Center's building fund, following the death of Seaford City Councilman Larry Miller.

The Commissioners made a donation to the Torch Run and Delaware Special Olympics. Police Officers Hitchens and Truluck represented the Town in the Torch Run.

The Town welcomes Patrolman Robert James to the Police Department. Our force has increased to seven Officers.

The Town has collected 110% of what was budgeted, due to income from quarterly tax billings, transfer taxes and building permits.

Code Enforcement Constable Jack Kimlel offered his resignation effective June 1, 2006. The Town appreciates his assistance and expertise for the past two years.

The Commission held a public hearing and adopted the FY-07 Budget.

The Planning Commission recommended approval of an Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan after several meetings and a public hearing. The amendment primarily addresses changes to the Town's proposed growth area.

The Commission adopted a Resolution declaring October 2006 as Italian Heritage Month.

A Summer Youth Employment Program was announced to assist the Public Works Department in maintenance jobs. Four youth and an adult supervisor will be hired.

Town Manager's Report

Our Second Annual Memorial Day Celebration was held at the Veterans Memorial in the Bridgeville Cemetery. We appreciate all our residents who joined together to honor our veterans. A special thank you to those who helped make the Celebration a success - ROTC Gunny Michael Janiszewski, Christen Hatfield, Lay Reader Mary Parsons, Melissa Baker and Reverend Raymond Taylor. We pay our respects to all veterans - those who have served in the past and those who are currently serving our great nation - not just on Memorial Day, but every day. We thank you.

Maintenance and general upkeep of the Children's Sanctuary Park is ongoing. President Jim Mitchell reports new mulch will be spread throughout the Park, needed equipment repaired and a fresh coat of waterproof stain applied to all wooden structures. We appreciate the Kiwanis Club of Bridgeville for their manpower assistance.

A special thanks goes to Wastewater Superintendent Mowbray and Water Superintendent Jones for their extra efforts during the June rain storm and flooding. They deserve a great deal of credit for keeping our water/sewer system operational.

I would like to personally thank Mr. Ralph Scott, III for his generous donation of furniture from Scott's Furniture, Inc. for the Town Hall lobby. It helps to establish a professional atmosphere and we sincerely appreciate his kind gesture.

Look for street and curbing repairs to begin in the near future throughout Town. We acknowledge the faithful support of Senator Adams and Representative Ewing in making these improvements possible.

We have made an effort to identify Town events and assemble a yearly calendar. Please contact the Town office to add additional information to the calendar. Thanks to Town Secretary Peggy Smith for her work in compiling the calendar.

Highlights of the Town of Bridgeville Fiscal 2007 Budget

As a result of the growth of the Town's assessment base, the municipal tax rate has been reduced from \$1.83 to \$1.73 per hundred of the Town assessment (a five percent reduction.) Additionally, fees for Town water, sewer and garbage services will remain the same, although operation costs have increased.

A Spring Clean-up Day will be scheduled in addition to the annual Fall date.

The Police Department parking lot will be repaved and upgrades will be made to building security. The starting salary for a Town Officer has been increased to \$30,000 to remain competitive with other municipalities. A Public Safety Director will be hired and the Town's Pension Plan will be changed to allow an Officer to retire after 20 years of service with the Town. The Police Department will apply for a \$30,000 Sussex County Council Grant for necessary equipment purchases and to enhance operations.

Monies have been budgeted for street and curbing repairs. These monies have been solicited through Senator Adams and Representative Ewing, who have been responsible for the majority of street improvements in Bridgeville during their tenure.

Grants in Aid to a number of Community Organizations are again included in this year's budget.

Funds are included to complete the Public Works building that will house the new street sweeper and offices for the Water and Street Departments. This Budget also allows for the hiring of a new Public Works employee to assist with Street, Water and Wastewater operations.

Bridgeville will continue to offer a quality benefit package to its employees. A modernized pay scale has been adopted, establishing wages and pay grades for full-time employees based on job description. Salaries have been modified to bring all employees into their appropriate pay grade. Cost of Living and Merit increases are included, based upon Commissioner approval and employee evaluations. Commissioner salaries have been increased to \$1,800 for the President and \$1,200 for the remaining Commissioners.

The Town Code is being updated with recently adopted ordinances and charter changes.

Monies are included in the budget to purchase seasonal banners for the Town's streets.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant Screen House will be painted. Construction upgrades will begin and the water tower maintenance lease will continue.

Also, please continue to trim trees to accommodate the 12-foot clearance needed by the street sweeper to clean close to the curbs.

Pool meters are again available from the Town Hall for those who are interested. The metered hose will allow you to fill your pool with water one time only during the summer charging only for water, not for sewer. Pool meters must be returned within one week.

- No weeds, grass or other ground cover vegetation over 8 inches is allowed.
- Weeds, grass or other vegetation, clippings, etc. may not be placed on any street, alleyway, or walkway.
- All tree and lawn trimmings must be disposed of properly. No accumulation is allowed.
- Please contact Town Hall before erecting an inground or above-ground pool with a depth greater than 2 feet. A permit is required and there are regulations concerning its location on the property and fencing requirements.


