From the President's Desk

The Bridgeville Town Commission is pleased to announce the Inaugural Bridgeville Charity Open Golf Tournament. This event will take place on Friday, October 12, 2007 at the Heritage Shores Golf Club located here in Bridgeville, Delaware. Proceeds from this event will benefit three local organizations, which include the Bridgeville Kiwanis Foundation, the Bridgeville Lions Club and the Bridgeville Senior Center. These organizations provide a host of services across a broad spectrum of Bridgeville residents. We are also pleased to announce that \$10,000 has already been pledged by Allen & Rocks, Lennar Homes and Providence of Brookfield Homes. We welcome additional sponsors. Details can be found on page 4 of this newsletter.

The Commission is presently discussing an Ordinance that would control hours of construction to preserve some peace and tranquility throughout your Town. The proposed Ordinance would exempt homeowners from the requirements of this act, but would limit the hours of operation for outside contractors. Work done inside the home would also be exempt.

The Commission has established a number of Committees within our Town to involve more people in the government. These committees include the Planning and Zoning Commission, Parks and Recreation, Emergency Planning, Town Beautification, Citizens Advisory and an Election Board. A number of appointments have been made, but we are still looking for volunteers for the Neighborhood Watch and Celebration and Commemoration Committees. In addition we have sent letters to all the businesses in Town asking for volunteers to sit on the Economic Development / Main Street Committee. Several businesses have already expressed interest and we hope many more will respond.

The Bridgeville Police Department has begun an "Officer of the Quarter" Award program and we are pleased to announce that Officer Robert James was the first recipient of this award. Mr. James graduated from Woodbridge High School. See page 4 for more information.

We are pleased to announce that the bid for construction of our new wastewater facility has been awarded to Daisey Construction. Hopefully, work will begin in June of this year with completion of our plant upgrade and spray irrigation site by early next year.

The Commission has introduced the Fiscal 2008 Budget prepared by our Town Manager and Finance Director, with the assistance of our department heads. The public hearing for this budget will be Monday, June 11th during our regularly scheduled Commission meeting, which begins at 7:00 P.M. We are again pleased to report that this balanced budget with a sizeable reserve contains no tax or fee increases.

Commissioner Earl Greason is now updating the Town Website. You will find much more details on your Town's operations at www.townofbridgeville.net.

Minutes from the Monthly Commission Meetings

April 9, 2007

March Traffic Arrests: 248 Criminal Arrests: 64

Twenty-six building permits were issued in March bringing revenue of \$8,288.50. Four certificates of occupancy for new homes were issued.

Eight water meters were installed at Heritage Shores and seven water/sewer inspections were completed..

The Bridgeville Water Department supplied 4,743,289 gallons of water to residents during the month of March!

M.V. Painters of Laurel, Delaware was awarded a contract to paint the screening building at the wastewater treatment plant. Work should begin in April.

Preston Ford in Preston, Maryland was awarded the contract to supply a new utility pick-up truck for the Public Works Department. This will replace a 1989 truck and will have snow plow capabilities.

Public Works employees attended a pre-construction meeting at the Department of Transportation regarding the Route 13 and Route 404 street improvements, which are scheduled to begin in June..

Handicap ramps and domes were repaired on William and Laws Sts. and the catch basin was repaired in front of Craft's Deli.

The National Arbor Day Foundation has named Bridgeville a 2006 Tree City USA.

The Town saved \$10,000 in snow removal supplies due to the mild winter.

A successful Annexation Referendum was held on March 24th bringing into Town limits the Baldwin property on the west side of Bridgeville.

Ordinance A07-1 was adopted raising the fee for Variance, Zoning & Conditional Use Hearings to \$500. This increase allows the Town to better cover the cost of these requests.

Ordinance A07-2 was adopted setting a penalty fee for industrial, commercial or non-Bridgeville wastewater users who exceed their EDU allocations.

The Town is exploring the possible construction of a larger Town Hall in the future. Assistance grants are being considered and the Town has accepted a contract from Davis, Bowen & Friedel, Inc. for architectural and engineering services for the proposed facility.

A 200-level Incident Command System training course was held for Administration and Public Works employees to prepare the Town for emergencies that include extreme weather, terrorism, etc.

May 7, 2007

April Traffic Arrests: 268 Criminal Arrests: 68

Thirteen building permits were issued in April bringing revenue of \$5,948.00. Five certificates of occupancy for new homes were issued.

Twelve untagged or inoperable vehicles were turned over to the Bridgeville Police Department for investigation.

Thirteen water meters were installed at Heritage Shores and one water/sewer inspection was completed.

A new radio read system for water meters is being installed at Heritage Shores and later throughout Town. This allows the Public Works Department to read water meters while driving by the property in a vehicle.

Weeds were sprayed along curbs and sidewalks throughout Town.

Annual preventative maintenance was performed on the sewage raw pumps and the sewage grinder at the Heritage Shores pump station.

The Bridgeville Police Department applied for a grant to participate in the "Click It or Ticket" Campaign.

Wastewater Superintendent Mowbray was honored for reaching 100 consecutive months without an NPDES violation in March, 2007. Superintendents Jones and Passwaters were recognized for their assistance.

Verizon will lease space on the water tower next to the wastewater treatment plant to install, maintain and operate radio communications equipment, antennas, etc. The Town will receive income from this lease arrangement.

Administrative staff met with the State Department of Elections concerning newly adopted municipal election laws which will go into effect this year.

The Town is hopeful it will be approved for the Summer Youth Employment Program through the state. The Town will also hire one youth to work for the summer.

The Commission made appointments to various Town committees based on residents' areas of interest.

Ordinance A07-5 was adopted allowing Mr. and Mrs. Timothy Banks to operate a large day care center at 11 Church St.

The Town is submitting a pre-application to the Delaware Land & Water Conservation Trust Fund to initiate a walking path or "Riverwalk" on the south side of Bridgeville Branch from N. Main St. to the Bridgeville Cemetery.

The Commissioners proclaimed May 20-26, 2007 as "Come to Church Week."

The FY-08 Budget was introduced and reviewed.

Officer of the Quarter

Patrolman Robert H. James, Jr.

The Police Department has initiated this program to recognize the outstanding work of its police force.

Patrolman James is our newest officer; however, based on the variety of cases he has handled, he is becoming a well rounded officer.

In the first quarter of 2007 Patrolman James made 225 traffic arrests, 82 criminal arrests and handled 79 complaints. Among his traffic arrests, 3 defendants were charged with driving under the influence of alcohol and several cases involved the seizure of marijuana. He apprehended an out of state fugitive and made an arrest for carrying a concealed deadly weapon.

Bridgeville Police Department Traffic Stop

On March 14th Patrolman First Class Spicer, a 3-year veteran of the Bridgeville Police Department, stopped a vehicle for exceeding the speed limit on US Route 13 southbound within the limits of the Town. Officer Spicer noted the operator was extremely nervous. Further investigation revealed that the operator was driving without a valid license. A consent search of the vehicle exposed 5.2 pounds of suspected marijuana, 208 grams of suspected powder cocaine and several items of drug paraphernalia. The operator and the passenger, who was also the owner of the vehicle, were arrested on 19 criminal charges and were later committed to the Department of Corrections in default of approximately \$890,000 cash bond each.

Highlights of the Town of Bridgeville Fiscal 2008 Budget

The Municipal Tax Rate will remain \$1.73 per hundred of the Town Assessment. Additionally, fees for Town water and sewer services will remain the same although operational costs have increased. The garbage fee will remain \$13.25, but is subject to an increase in November once a new contract is awarded.

The Town will again host a Fall & Spring Clean-up Day.

The Police Department will again apply for a Sussex County Council Grant. The anticipated amount of the grant is \$25,000; it would be used to purchase a new vehicle so that the Town can retire one of its older police vehicles.

Monies continue to be budgeted to make needed street and curbing repairs throughout Town. These monies will be solicited from Senator Adams and Representative Ewing, who have been responsible for the majority of street and curbing improvements done in Bridgeville during their tenure.

Funds are included to complete and furnish the new Public Works building that will house the new Street Sweeper and offices for the Water and Street Departments.

Grants in Aid to a number of Community Organizations are again included in this year's budget.

Bridgeville will continue to offer a quality benefit package to its employees. Cost of Living and Merit increases are also provided in the FY-08 budget based upon Commissioner approval and employee evaluations.

The Town Code will be updated with recently adopted ordinances and charter changes.

Monies are included in this budget to purchase additional seasonal banners for the Town's streets.

The Wastewater Sand Filter Building will be painted.

Construction upgrades to the Wastewater Treatment Plant will take place this budget year.

The maintenance lease will continue on the water tower at the WWTP.

Bridgeville will hold its 3rd Annual National Night Out on August 22nd.

An additional police officer will be hired in January 2008 and a full-time secretary will be employed at the Police Department.

The Water Department will begin upgrading the older water meters throughout Town.

Pool Owners

Pool meters are again available from the Town Hall for those who are interested. The metered hose will allow you to fill your pool with water

one time only
during the summer

charging only for water, not for sewer. Pool meters must be returned within one week.

Please Pay Special Attention to These Town Codes During the Summer and Fall Seasons

- No unregulated growth of vegetation is allowed, including weeds, grass, hedges and bushes or shrubs.
- No weeds, grass or other ground cover vegetation over 8 inches is allowed.
- Weeds, grass or other vegetation, clippings, etc. may not be placed on any street, alleyway, or walkway.
- All tree and lawn trimmings must be disposed of properly. No accumulation allowed.
- Please contact Town Hall before erecting an in-ground or above-ground pool with a depth greater than 2 feet. A permit is required and there are regulations concerning its location on the property and fencing requirements.
