From the President's Desk

After an unusually mild summer, we're starting to have crisp evenings that signal Fall is on its way and these months are certainly a busy time for Bridgeville. We hope you will take full advantage of all the Bridgeville events listed below.

I'd like to give you a little taste of what all our Apple Scrapple Festival visitors will learn about our Festival in this year's Apple Scrapple ad booklet. It reads as follows:

"This neighborhood event has grown from simple beginnings until today it rivals any festival on the Eastern Shore. In 2008 the Apple Scrapple Festival, Inc. received the Southern Delaware Tourism Recognition Award and the Festival was listed in the 2010 American Bus Association's 'Top 100 Events in North America'. Both of these are well-deserved honors for this small committee of local residents and their tireless efforts to create a successful festival experience.

An added advantage to this local festival is its dedication to the fundraising efforts of non-profit agencies and community/school organizations. All of Bridgeville benefits, from the Senior Center to the 4-H; from the Music Boosters to our local Church organizations. This event is truly a community happening. We are proud of our town and the people who make it great."

Bridgeville is pleased to welcome three new officers to our Police Force. Patrolmen John Cullen, Samuel Wilks and Justin Wechtenhiser graduated from the Delaware State Police Academy in early August and the Town Commission convened a Swearing-In Ceremony on August 8th. The department now has a full complement of 7 officers, Police Chief Robert Longo and Part-time Secretary, Robin Bohn.

Heritage Shores is growing! The Planning and Zoning Commission and Town Commissioners are beginning to review a new Phase III of the project. This new phase is proposed to bring approximately 275 more units over a span of several years.

The Town has received approval from the Delaware Department of Transportation (DelDOT) for a repair/replacement project on Mill Street. Our thanks to Senator Pettyjohn and Representative Wilson who are funding the project through their Community Transportation Funds (CTF). The project estimate is \$125,000.



Minutes from the Monthly Commission Meetings

July, August, September 2013

The Woodbridge Future Farmers of America (FFA) Issues Team practiced their Delaware State Fair public speaking topic (Delaware Farm Vehicle Tags) for the Commissioners and citizens at the July 8th Commission meeting. The group went on to win the state competition and will compete at the national level in Louisville Kentucky this November. Representative Dave Wilson will accompany the team and is himself a candidate for national honors for his support of FFA. As auctioneer for the State Fair, Wilson reported the farm animal auction for 4-H and FFA brought approximately \$180,000 for the organizations this year. Thanks to Mrs. Karen Breeding for her leadership of the Woodbridge FFA.

The Commissioners continue to watch House Bill 81, which has been tabled, but will re-surface in January when the Senate reconvenes. This bill would reduce the number of full-time Police employees the Town must employ from 25 to 3 to require collective bargaining and would be extremely detrimental to Bridgeville and other small towns in Delaware.

Paving projects were completed in Town during the summer months. The Town Hall parking lot has been re-paved, adding additional spaces by changing the layout of the parking lot. A portion of Railroad Avenue and the Sewer Treatment Plant entrance were also paved. The projects were made possible by Community Transportation Funds (CTF) that were allocated to Bridgeville by former Senator Booth.

Brookfield Homes has worked to alleviate the water drainage concerns on the south side of the main entrance to Heritage Shores. The Town is appreciative of the steps that have been taken.

The 2013 property tax levy was finalized and bills were sent, after review by the Town Auditor, Lank, Johnson & Tull. The amount billed was \$519,489.00.

Two new police vehicles have been ordered to replace 2003 and 2005 Crown Victoria cars currently in the fleet.

The Delaware Department of Transportation (DelDOT) advised \$49,321.55 in Municipal Street Aid funds has been allocated to Bridgeville. The amount is based on the Town's 9.21 miles of roadway and a population of 2,048 (latest census figure).

The Town has completed an Inflow and Infiltration Project, funded by a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) grant which investigated extraneous water infiltrating our sewage system. The Town anticipates repairs to the Bridgeville Branch to correct an intrusion point; the Branch has been leaking into our system approximately 30,000 gallons per day. The repairs were to begin in September when the Branch water level was low. The Town could realize a 10% reduction in treated wastewater with these repairs.

Heritage Shores is pursuing curb / gutter replacements and street / sidewalk paving of several newer streets in the development. This project is necessary before the Town Commission and Street Department can accept these streets for Town maintenance.

After review by the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Town Commission, a Heritage Shores Landscaping and Maintenance Plan was approved for the development with a maximum grass height of 21" for undeveloped areas and 8' for developed areas (golf course excluded).

New Woodbridge High School Update Superintendent Heath Chasanov

As we move from summer to early fall, and the Woodbridge School District students and staff return to school, the construction work on your new Woodbridge High School has pressed on. Construction crews have had a very busy summer construction schedule and they look forward to achieving our short-term goal of having the building enclosed and weather proof by the fall of 2013. The summer construction schedule saw the completion of the majority of the exterior brick and façade, the installation of the final layers of roofing materials and flashing, the installation of windows and doors, as well as the roadwork to improve and widen Woodbridge Road approximately the length of the property. Despite the especially wet summer we experienced, I am proud to announce that the project remains on-time, with student occupancy still planned for the beginning of the 2014/2015 school year. While it is important to meet time schedules and open the school as planned, it is more important to maintain construction quality, to which I am honored to report that our skilled group of contractors and trades-people obviously have been taking great pride in their work. The quality of the workmanship on your new high school is second-to-none. Even work that will be covered-up and never seen, is being performed with pride

of workmanship and exacting precision. The project budget remains intact and despite two unforeseen conditions that drew funds from the project contingency, the project remains on budget.

The school's two-story design continues to feature an efficient HVAC system; energy conserving lighting system equipped with occupancy sensors to turn lights off automatically when no one is present; low-flow flush valves and fixtures; up-graded long wearing floor materials; and a state of the art security system complete with access control and high resolution cameras. The new Woodbridge High School will most likely be the most technologically advanced school in the State when it is completed. Students and staff will benefit from wireless access that will allow technology users to access the building's network from anywhere throughout the building.

I hope all the students and staff of the Woodbridge School District enjoyed a happy, healthy and relaxing summer break. As you enjoyed your break, the work on your New Woodbridge High School did not slow down, rather, it continued – aggressively and with the highest quality workmanship possible.

From the Code Department

YARD SALES DURING THE APPLE SCRAPPLE FESTIVAL may take place on personal properties; however, retail merchandise must be approved through the Apple Scrapple Festival Vendor Application process OR you may obtain a Soliciting & Peddling Permit from the Town office, which requires a Delaware state license. Used items only may be sold at yard sales on October 12th. All yard sales must be shut down by 2 PM.

YARD WASTE may not be stored on any property in Town. Visit www.dswa.com (Delaware Solid Waste Authority) for information about the Bridgeville Collection Station (16539 Polk Rd.) and the Jones Crossroads Landfill (28560 Landfill Rd., Georgetown) for disposal of accumulated yard waste.

OFF-STREET PARKING (i.e. driveways) must be surfaced with an erosion-resistant material, such as stone, shell or blacktop. Vehicles must be parked on the street if a homeowner's current parking area is not properly surfaced.

Please check the **SIDEWALKS** on your property for deterioration. Evaluate and take necessary action to keep our sidewalks safe for pedestrians.


