- Charter changes have been made concerning annexation and re-financing, which are advantageous to the Town.
- Also on the horizon is the construction of a new Police Station for the Town.

Snow Reminders

Shoveling Snow/ice must be removed within twenty-four (24) hours of it ceasing to accumulate, according to Town Code. The owner or occupant of any building or lot abutting a public sidewalk is responsible to keep it clear of snow/ice. Additionally, in order for your letter carrier provide you with uninterrupted service, residents must clear the approach to their mailbox.

Snow Plowing /Salting of Roads When snow begins to fall, residents having access to their yard from an alleyway must park their vehicles there. If a driveway does not exist, all residents must move vehicles to the even-numbered side of the street. When the odd-numbered side of the street has been cleared of snow/ice, residents must move vehicles to the odd-numbered side of the street. This will allow the Town to clear the streets completely and efficiently, without the need for residents to shovel their respective parking spaces.



If you are out of Town for an extended period of time during the winter months, you must make arrangements for your sidewalks to be shoveled in your absence.

Minutes from the Monthly Commission Meetings

October / November / December 2015

Please welcome Mrs. Ashley Walls to our Town staff. Ashley manages the front office at Town Hall as Town Clerk and will assist residents with payments and other concerns. Please stop by and welcome her to Bridgeville. Ms. April Buckler has moved upstairs to assist Town Manager with the needs of our growing Town.

The current Police Station is past its useful service, with deterioration that cannot be repaired. The Commission is working with Town Engineer Davis, Bowen & Friedel, Inc. concerning a new facility. A proposed layout for the new Station has been presented for Town property at 105 S. Main St. ADA compliance will be required in the complex.

The new Dollar General store exterior is complete, as well as the sewer main replacement along John Street and parking lot paving. They will soon be stocking the shelves. An opening date has not yet been scheduled.

You may have noticed maintenance being completed at Town Hall in recent months. The landscaping has been updated at the front entrance and a new back door has been installed. We extend a special thanks to our Town staff who ably completed these projects. In addition, leaky gutters have been replaced and the building was power washed in November.

Bridgeville continues to participate in Sussex County's Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), assisting the Town in renovations/demolitions for low and moderate income families. Over the past 15 years Bridgeville has received \$600,000 for projects.

The building at 17 Church St. has been referred to the Court of Chancery for a court order to demolish.

Mrs. Pam Slater and Mr. Carlos Alvarez were re-appointed to the Bridgeville Board of Adjustment for 3-year terms.

Grant applications have been submitted to DNREC and USDA to finance upgrades to the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant, as required by our state permit.

Town Manager Savage has submitted the FY16 Sussex County Revenue Sharing Grant application. The \$25,000 is used to assist in purchasing a new Police vehicle each year. Additionally, the Bridgeville Police Department has received a Criminal Justice Council Grant to purchase taser cartridges. The Town actively seeks funding for assistance in procuring needs as economically as possible.

Town Manager Savage attended the Delaware League of Local Governments Legislative Advisory Committee meeting in October to stay abreast of important issues for Delaware Towns. The committee attended various cabinet meetings, as well as meeting with the Governor prior to the legislative session. Many important issues are at stake for Bridgeville (Municipal Street Aid/Transfer Tax reduction).

A November workshop was held to consider the passage of a Source Water Protection Ordinance, required by state law. Discussion centered around the wellhead protection area near the intersection of Routes 13 and 404. The Town, Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control and Tidewater Utilities have joined together to determine a new well head protection area.

The CPA firm of Lank, Johnson and Tull presented the FY-2015 Audit Report at the December Commission meeting. Mr. Rick Tull advised the Town has a great balance sheet and has done a good job of controlling expenses, with an overall increase of only 2%. If we were a for-profit business, our net profit would be \$761,000. A portion of that profit was used to close-out a Wastewater loan 15 years early! The Town is committed to pay-down its debt.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's seasonal outlook for this winter predicts a moderately wetter season than those in recent years and slightly warmer than normal, according to NOAA's long-range outlook issued in mid-November. Forecasters say the wetter/warmer forecast is thanks to a strong El Niño pattern, the phenomenon of warming waters in the east-central Pacific Ocean that can have global effects, including an increase in nor'easter activity along the East Coast of the United States.

Preventive Measures

- Spread ice melting agent on walkways/driveways to keep surfaces free of ice; improve traction w/ sand
- Keep snow shovels & other equipment handy
- Winterize your vehicle; keep gas tank full to avoid ice in tank and fuel lines
- Check antifreeze levels
- Ensure heater/defroster work properly
- Pack a winterization kit: sand/kitty litter
ice scraper blankets de-icer for door locks
- Create a Safety Profile for your household with the county's free Smart911.com service to provide potentially critical, life saving information up front

During the Storm

- Listen to above sources for current information
- Eat regularly; drink ample fluids; avoid caffeine/alcohol
- Conserve fuel/power - keep residence cool; close off heat to some rooms
- Limit unnecessary travel; heed all advisories/warnings
- Dress for the weather

Code Updates

2016 Contractor / Subcontractor Licensing

Bridgeville has a yearly licensing requirement for all contractors/subcontractors working in Town. Any "new work" being performed inside/outside your home may be subject to the contractor licensing. Not included are contractors performing work or providing materials for the repair, restoration or maintenance of previously existing work.

Homeowners must direct their contractor to the Town office to fill out necessary paperwork and pay the yearly \$50 fee in order to work in Bridgeville.

Driveway Material

All off-street parking areas must be surfaced with erosion-resistant material in accordance with Town standards, i.e. stone, CR6, clamshells, blacktop or cement. Cars may not park on dirt or grass.

January is re-registration time for all pit bulls in Bridgeville.
