### Snow Reminders

**Shoveling** Snow/ice must be removed within twenty-four (24) hours of it ceasing to accumulate, according to Town Code. The owner or occupant of any building or lot abutting a public sidewalk is responsible to keep it clear of snow/ice. Additionally, in order for your letter carrier to provide you with uninterrupted service, residents must clear the approach to their mailbox.

**Snow Plowing /Salting of Roads** When snow begins to fall, residents having access to their yard from an alleyway must park their vehicles there. If a driveway does not exist, all residents must move vehicles to the even-numbered (house numbers) side of the street. When the odd-numbered side of the street has been cleared of snow/ice, residents must move vehicles to the odd-numbered side of the street. This will allow the Town to clear the streets completely and efficiently, without the need for residents to shovel their respective parking spaces. **Please use ice melt on sidewalks instead of salt.**



If you are out of Town for an extended period of time during the winter months, you must make arrangements for your sidewalks to be shoveled in your absence.

### Code Updates

#### 2019 Business License

Bridgeville has a new annual licensing requirement for all Business working in Town. All Business must register with Town Hall and pay the annual fee of \$100. If your business is within town limits then you must fill out the application but do not have to pay the fee.

#### Rental License

Per Town Code, homeowners who rent their homes are responsible for obtaining a Rental License with the Town and having an inspection done by the Code Enforcement Officer. The fee is \$25 per bedroom.

#### Vacant Property Registration.

Vacant property owners will need to register their properties Annually with the Town. \$100 for the first year it is vacant, 2-3 years is \$300 and 5+ years is \$500.

## Sussex County Emergency Operations Center

### Dress for the weather:

- ◆ Wear layers of loose-fitting, thin, warm clothing rather than one layer of heavy clothing.
  - ◆ Outer garments should be tightly woven and water repellant;
  - ◆ Wear mittens, which are warmer than gloves, as well as a hat;
  - ◆ Cover your mouth with a scarf to protect your lungs. Ensure the heater and defroster work properly; Check lights and flashing hazard lights for serviceability
  - ◆ Pack a winterization kit that includes an ice scraper, de-icer for door locks, blankets, and sand or kitty litter to provide traction if your vehicle becomes stranded;
- Create a Safety Profile for your household with the County's free Smart911.com service to provide potentially critical, life-saving information up front.

### During a Storm

- \*\* Listen to Television/Radio, or NOAA Weather Radio for weather and emergency information
- \*\* Visit the Sussex County EOC website/Facebook at [www.facebook.com/Sussex CountyDE](http://www.facebook.com/SussexCountyDE)
- \*\* Visit [www.sussexcountyde.gov/emergency-preparedness](http://www.sussexcountyde.gov/emergency-preparedness) for weather information/tips

#### Preventive Measures

- Spread ice melt on walkways/driveways to keep surfaces free of ice; improve traction with sand
- Keep snow shovels & other equipment handy
- Winterize your vehicle; keep gas tank full to avoid ice in tank and fuel lines
- Check antifreeze levels
- Ensure heater/defroster work properly
- Pack a winterization kit: sand/kitty litter  
ice scraper blankets de-icer for door locks
- Create a Safety Profile for your household with the county's free Smart911.com service to provide potentially critical, life saving information up front.

#### During the Storm

- Listen to above sources for current information
- Eat regularly; drink ample fluids; avoid caffeine/alcohol
- Conserve fuel/power - keep residence cool; close off heat to some rooms
- Limit unnecessary travel; heed all advisories/warnings
- Dress for the weather

## Bridgeville Economic Development Committee (EDC)

The Economic Development Committee (EDC) is working with the High School and Middle School art classes on a painting contest for eight rocking chairs. The theme is Bridgeville Past, Present and Future. We hope to place the finished chairs at various locations around town this spring. Sponsorships for the chairs are available, if interested please contact Town Hall. The new Town entrance signs on Hwy 13 are awaiting DelDOT approval: The EDC is hopeful they will be installed soon. The EDC is also working with DelDOT on an upgrade to some crosswalks and traffic boxes with the use of artistic designs. This year's Christmas Parade was sponsored by the EDC and the EDC would like to thank Bob Lewis for taking the lead on the event. It was the epitome of a rural town parade and the crowds seemed to love it. The EDC wants to remind downtown business owners of the ongoing matching Grant program of up to \$2,500 for façade improvements. The EDC is working with the town and a landscape architect on a replacement for the Memorial Parklet next to the town hall. We hope to tie the design into a long term plan for the entire area around and behind town hall. The founder of Delaware Decision Makers has agreed to work with the EDC in developing some more detailed business development plans for the town. The EDC welcomes community members, businesses and residents, who would like to join the Committee. They meet at Town Hall on the third Wednesday of the month at 3:00 pm.


