## **2023 Commission Election**


Bridgeville's next election will be held on **Saturday**, **March 4, 2023**. This election will be for three (3) Commission seats:

**District 4** – Currently, Tom Carey.

**District 3** – Formerly Districts 3 and 5 – Currently held by John Tomeski and Bruce Smith – This seat will be for the one-year remainder of a two-year term.

**District 1** – New District within Heritage Shores – Currently empty.

We know the redistricting process and numbering is confusing – and they have been renumbered, so we have large maps printed on display in Town Hall, and an electronic copy is available on our website under "Info" and "Elections."



**Deadline for Candidate Filing:** February **3, 2023** (Notice for solicitation of candidates will run in early January)

Absentee Ballots: Available by February 17, 2023

**Deadline for Voter Registration: February 22, 2023** 

Election Day: Saturday, March 4, 2023

#### **Winter Weather Reminders**

**Snow:** Snow/ice must be removed within twenty-four (24) hours of it ceasing to accumulate, according to Town Code. The owner or occupant of any building or lot abutting a public sidewalk is responsible for keeping it clear of snow/ice. Additionally, for your letter carrier to provide you with uninterrupted service, residents must clear the approach to their mailbox.

**Snow Plowing /Salting of Roads:** When the snow begins to fall, residents having access to their yard from an alleyway must park their vehicles there. If a driveway does not exist, all residents must move vehicles to the even-numbered (house numbers) side of the street. When the odd-numbered side of the street has been cleared of snow/ice, residents must move vehicles to the street's odd-numbered side.

Please use ice melt on sidewalks instead of salt. If you are out of town for an extended period during the winter months, you must make arrangements for your sidewalks to be shoveled in your absence.
