

# **Grass and Yard Maintenance Code**

Now that Spring has officially sprung - Reminder of Chapter 90 of the Town Code - No landowner shall permit the unregulated growth of vegetation, including but not limited to weeds, grass, hedges, bushes, or shrubs, to be maintained on any property within the corporate limits of the Town of Bridgeville. No weeds, grass, or other ground cover vegetation shall exceed a height of eight inches at any time of the calendar year. No hedges, bushes, shrubs, trees, or other vegetation shall be permitted to grow in such a manner as to inhibit the free passage of or present a danger to pedestrians on any street, alleyway, sidewalk, or walkway. No weeds, grass, or other vegetation clippings, etc., shall be placed on any street, alleyway, passageway, sidewalk, or walkway.

### **Sussex County Sewer System Work**

This month, Sussex County will perform extensive repairs and maintenance on several sewer lines in Town. The work is currently planned for the western end of Federalsburg Road, (In front of Shark's Service Center), Market Street from the railroad tracks to the Bridgeville Town Hall, Walnut Street from the S. Cannon intersection to Main Street, Edgewood Street from the S. Cannon intersection to Main Street, Sussex Avenue from 100 Block West to the end (not Sussex Extended), Church Street near Phyllis Wheatley Elementary School (no service impacts to residents in this area, construction notice only).

The repairs and maintenance involve lining the sewer mains with a plastic resin and will create service disruptions for those in the immediate area of construction. We have posted the notice along with a map on our social media and website. For those directly impacted, the County and their contractors will make direct contact prior to the start of work.

## April 1, 2023, EF-3 Tornado and Disaster Relief

Saturday's tornado in Sussex County, now rated by the National Weather Service as an EF-3, is believed to be the strongest tornado ever recorded in southern Delaware since records began in the 1950s. The tragic loss of life is also the first recorded in Sussex County in the same time period. The tornado with winds of 140mph, left a path of devastation and destruction 14.3 miles long, from just northwest of Town, continuing northeast to Ellendale. Outside of Ellendale, all the damage occurred in unincorporated areas of Bridgeville and Greenwood, which means the Towns can't use their funded resources to assist residents. **Since this is still our community** – our neighbors and friends, we are using the resources we can pull to help those in need. Outside of volunteering, we are coordinating and collaborating with several local nonprofit organizations that are working directly with families – collecting supplies and gathering funding. **In the next two weeks, we will be**announcing and holding some larger scale fundraising events to help these families. Please follow our social media and website as we share information and ways to get involved and help. The outpouring of volunteers since Sunday morning has been amazing, and we hope to see those efforts continue, as there is a long way to go for recovery and reconstruction.
