The Bridgeville Municipal Election will be at the Bridgeville Public

Library, 600 S. Cannon Street, between the hours of 12:00 PM and 7:00 PM. The Bridgeville Commissioners have established five Election Voting Districts for Municipal Elections, This year, Districts 2, 3, and 5 residents will each vote for a candidate from their district to represent them on the Commission. All districts are for full two-year terms. Please note that the Town underwent Redistricting in 2022, and the districts were changed. If you are uncertain of your district, a voting district map is available for review at Bridgeville Town Hall and online at Bridgeville.delaware.gov.

The Town is currently soliciting candidates in Districts 2, 3, and 5 for the 2024 Municipal Election. The following qualifications apply to all candidates: (1) U.S. Citizen at least 21 years of age on or before the Election date; (2) Bridgeville Resident and Registered Voter in the State of Delaware for at least one year immediately preceding the Election date; (3) Registered Voter in the State of Delaware; (4) Lives within the Election Voting District they wish to represent; (5) Not convicted of a Felony. Prospective candidates must file a written letter of intent with the Commission President or Secretary, along with other filing requirements, by 4:00 PM on February 2, 2024. All required flyers, forms, and additional information can also be found at Bridgeville.delaware.gov under "Info" and "Elections." Every U.S. citizen at least eighteen years of age and who has resided in Bridgeville for at least thirty days shall have one vote in their voting district during the election, provided they have registered in the State of Delaware. No person registered after February 20, 2024, shall be allowed to vote in the 2024 Municipal Election.

Winter Weather Reminders

Snow: Snow/ice must be removed within twenty-four (24) hours of it ceasing to accumulate, according to Town Code. The owner or occupant of any building or lot abutting a public sidewalk is responsible for keeping it clear of snow/ice. Additionally, for your letter carrier to provide you with uninterrupted service, residents must clear the approach to their mailbox.

Snow Plowing /Salting of Roads: When the snow begins to fall, residents having access to their yards from an alleyway must park their vehicles there. If a driveway does not exist, all residents must move vehicles to the even-numbered (house numbers) side of the street. When the odd-numbered side of the street has been cleared of snow/ice, residents must move vehicles to the street's odd-numbered side.

Please use ice melt on sidewalks instead of salt. If you are out of town for an extended period during the winter months, you must make arrangements for your sidewalks to be shoveled in your absence.

Fees at Town Hall

The Fee Schedule for all fees at Town Hall is as follows:

Notary Services - \$5.00 (per stamp)

Fax - \$2.00 for up to 10 pages. To receive is per standard copy price. Fee includes transmission report copy. Cover page required.

Standard Copies - \$.25 per page 11"x17" to 12"x18" - \$1.00 per page

Scans - Standard size (8.5"x 11" and under) and emailed only, \$1.00 for up to 25 pages, (25-page increments) *Not for high resolution scans.

*We can also now provide higher resolution large format digital scans up to 24"x 36"- Scans will be emailed to you. We cannot <u>print</u> in large format. \$2.00 per page.
