A regularly scheduled meeting of the Commissioners of Bridgeville was held on February 10, 2025, at 7:00 PM, at the Bridgeville Town Hall, and via Zoom.

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by President Tomeski.

QUORUM PRESENT:

President Tomeski reported that a quorum was present to conduct Town business.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

A motion was made by Commissioner Harris and seconded by Commissioner Oliver to approve the agenda. Motion carried: 4 Yes votes, 0 No votes.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

A motion was made by Commissioner Harris to approve the minutes from January 13th and January 27th, seconded by Commissioner Oliver. Motion carried: 4 Yes votes, 0 No votes.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Commissioner Oliver submitted a letter withdrawing from the 2025 election.

Town Manager DeBussy read the following information from the January Financial reports:
