

Apple Scrapple Festival Updates

There are several changes to this year's festival that will affect residents. Traffic patterns have been updated and will include more street closures.

List of closed streets include Delaware Ave, Walnut Street, South Cannon Street, Laws Street, Williams Street, Railroad Ave, Mill Street, John Street, Mechanic Street, Cedar Street and Cherry Lane.

Resident and Business passes will be handled differently as the expected quantity has increased – resident/business owner must pick-up their pass at Town Hall or the library before October 9! Each pass will be resident/vehicle specific, please bring proof of residency when picking up your pass. For businesses, please bring a list of employees working that will need passes. The pass must be placed on the dash of your vehicle to allow you access to the alley behind your property on the days of the festival. Resident passes are for residents and employees working at an open business only; copies are not permitted.

Regardless of prior festival layouts or street closures, all residents within the streets on the new map will need passes.

What's Going There?

With all of the activity in Town, we get the question "What's going there?" asked VERY often. All of our projects and plan reviews are always available on our website. However, we've now made this a little easier for you to find. There is now a page under development called "What's Going There?" on our website. Head over to Bridgeville.delaware.gov, look under the "Info" tab, and then navigate to "What's Going There?" This page will help you identify approved projects happening within Town limits and link to relevant plan reviews or other information. It will be updated as we obtain information to share, so check back often! If you are uncertain about a project or activity, please contact us at Town Hall. We may be able to direct you to more information from there, or we may add something to the page we didn't previously have!

One of the highlights is the construction happening next to Town Hall, located between Town Hall and the Police Station. We are happily underway with the first phase of our park project! This work is made possible through community redevelopment funds, awarded by Senator Dave Wilson and Representative Jesse Vanderwende. Several elements will exist on this site, and we are just in the beginning. This project has been in planning and progress since 2021, and a concept plan is available on our new website page to help visualize the plan. We are combining the three entrances to Town Hall and the Police Station due to traffic and safety concerns, reworking the entrance and Town Hall parking lot, adding a designated space for our large holiday tree, creating a new space for a new LED sign/message board, and, of course, creating a small community park space. Last but certainly not least, this first phase of the project will also create the home of our memorial bricks project. The memorial bricks project first began in 2019 and was placed on hold during the COVID pandemic. From there, the bricks were re-incorporated into the new park plan, and we are now *finally* close to having them installed! Town staff is organizing prior brick reservations. We will be reaching out to all who contributed individually and announcing a small ceremony when we are closer to completion and can finalize a date. Once that is accomplished, we will be able to reopen the memorial bricks program for anyone else who wishes to contribute!


