

Meeting No. 25 (Regular) held in Town Office on Monday, Jan. 9, 1956.

Meeting called to order at 9:00 PM by Pres. Culver with all members present.

Motion by Rowe that the above bills be paid. Seconded by Willey and so carried.

A motion was made by Lawrence Rowe that a three car length section in front of the Post Office be marked off and parking for these three spaces limited to 15 minutes. Seconded by Short and so carried.

Fairbanks instructed by the Commissioners to paint all parking lines beside the Post Office on Cannon Street diagonal from the curb.

Meeting adjourned at 10:15 PM on a motion by Willey and a second by Short.
