Regularly moved, seconded and carried that the attached audit  
report be accepted as submitted by Stanley Ledenham and that  
said audit be made a part of these minutes.

Commissioner Simons introduced the following resolution and moved that it be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Bridgeville have determined it to be necessary that the existing storm and sanitary sewer system maintained by the Town of Bridgeville be improved and extended as hereinafter provided, and

WHEREAS, said Commissioners have determined it to be necessary to finance the cost of the construction of such improvements and extensions by the issuance of general obligation bonds of said Town and said Commissioners desire to propose to the freeholders of the Town of Bridgeville the purpose for which the necessary money shall be borrowed, NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of Bridgeville as follows:

1. It is hereby proposed to the freeholders of the Town of Bridgeville that general obligation bonds of said Town in the amount of \$500,000.00 be issued for the purpose of financing the cost of the construction of improvements and extensions to the storm and sanitary sewer system maintained by said Town consisting of the construction of a sewage treatment plant together with the installation of interceptor sewers, lateral sewers and metering stations. The form of the bonds, the dates of payment of interest maturity dates and registration provisions shall be determined by the Commissioners.

2. Said bonds shall be secured by a pledge of the full faith and credit of the Town of Bridgeville. Under the provisions of Chapter 237 of Vol. 51 of the laws of Delaware, as amended, should said bonds shall not exceed \$1,000,000 at any one time. The amount of interest to pay the interest and principal on the said bonds at the maturity or maturities thereof. Said Charter also provides that the total outstanding debt of the Town secured by general obligation bonds shall not exceed \$1,000,000 at any one time. The amount of general obligation bonds of the Town currently outstanding does not exceed \$—0—.

3. Said Charter further provides that before the Town of Bridgeville may incur indebtedness by the issuance of bonds a public hearing shall be held at which time all persons interested wishing to be heard shall be given an opportunity to express their views, which testimony shall be considered in evidence by the Commissioners and after said hearing the question of the issuance of such bonds shall be submitted to a referendum. No bond issue shall be deemed approved unless a majority of those voting at such referendum shall vote for such bond issue.

4. For the purpose of providing for the holding of the required hearing it is hereby determined that a hearing at which interested persons wishing to be heard on the question of the issuance of said bonds shall be given an opportunity to express their views shall be held at Bridgeville High School in said Town at 8 o'clock, p.m., on the 27th day of March, 1963.

5. An announcement of said hearing, consisting of a copy of this resolution, shall be published in The Bridgeville News, being a newspaper of general circulation in Sussex County nearest to the Town of Bridgeville at least one week prior to the 27th day of March, 1963.

6. The Secretary of the Commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to provide for the publication of the announcement of hearing as provided in Section 5 of this resolution.

Commissioner Short seconded the motion and the motion was adopted, Messers Willey, Meison and Culver voting in favor, and no one voting against it.
