

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
MARCH 9, 1970

Meeting called to order by President, Paul A. Lynch at
7 P.M.

Members present were Earl Willey, Wm. Reynolds, T. J. Gray, Jr.
and Richard Lewis.

Also present were Robert Dennis, from American Consumers
Industries, Inc. and Joseph Houtman from John H. Dulany & Co.

They came to discuss the sewer meter and were very confident
that it is not working properly and has not been for several
months.

They had asked the Board previously to make an adjustment
from July thru November as they had paid the town on 15,540,269
gallons they did not feel was correct. In money this would
have amounted to \$1573.23 on the basis they were being
charged. At that time the board decided to give them a
credit of \$393.31 which was 1/4 of the requested amount.
After a lengthy discussion and reviewing figures that they
had brought with them, the two men left.

After continued discussion on the matter the Board decided
to accept their figures. Motion was made by Wm. R. Reynolds
that we refund by credit-minus the amount previously given
what they had asked for. Seconded by Earl C. Willey,
approved by the Board.

In the meantime the meter will be checked and ready for use
when the plant starts to operate.

Meeting of two special meetings were read and approved.
There was a discussion in changing some of the building
ordinances as there will be an appeal day on March 21st,
as advertised in the paper.

Mr. Lynch asked the various departments if they had anything to report, as it was the end of the fiscal year they were planning the new budgets. T. J. Gray, Jr. and Earl C. Willey had to wait until the Police Budget could be finished to see if the police would be eligible for money from Federal and State. Mr. Gray said he would like to hire a fourth man.

Richard I. Lewis, Water Commissioner said he had decided not to change any water rates this year and would continue for another year on present rates. He presented his budget for the year and it was accepted by the Board.

Paul A. Lynch, presented his budget but wanted to make some changes to take care of capitol improvement.

Mr. Lynch requested that a letter be sent to Mr. Briggs of the Levy Court to see if the town might be able to put sludge in the County landfill near Bridgeville.

Davis Insurance Agency and Lewis Insurance Agency had submitted prices on insurance for our Sewer Plant men. After reviewing them a motion was made by T. J. Gray, Jr. that the Board accept figures of Lewis Insurance Agency. Seconded by Wm. R. Reynolds. Mr. Lewis who is a board member did not vote.

Being no further business meeting adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
