Motion made by Earl Willey to pay bills, seconded by Richard Lewis.

There was much discussion about budgets. T. J. Gray, Jr., Police Commissioner, presented two budgets. One showing assistance from Federal and State; the other without outside aid. Mr. Gray also said the police car needed new tires and he had some prices from Short's Service Station and Bannings Servicenter on same. Richard Lewis made a motion that Mr. Gray purchase the tires where he felt was the best buy. This was seconded by Earl C. Willey. T. J. Gray, Jr. made a motion to give Virgil Kinder, Lewis Frampton and Frank Galante a five dollar a week raise effective as of May 1, 1970. Seconded by Richard Lewis and approved by the Board. Motion was made by Richard Lewis that Lewis Frampton be made a Sargeant and Virgil Kinder a Corporal. Seconded by Earl C. Willey.

T. J. Gray, Jr. made a motion that alderman, George Torbert, be given a raise of \$5.00 per week effective May 1, 1970.. Seconded by Richard Lewis.

Motion made by Richard Lewis that we accept the police budgets as presented. Seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr. The number one budget without aid or the number two budget with aid if we get it.

Street Commissioner, Earl C. Willey, discussed his budget and decided to deduct \$2000 from his disbursements as presented. After reviewing the budget, a motion was made by T. J. Gray, Jr. that the street budget be adopted. Seconded by Richard Lewis.

Mr. Lynch discussed the Tax rate for 1970 and the Board decided to keep the present rate of \$.75 a hundred in taxes and \$.60 for sewer bond, making a total of \$1.35 per hundred. Earl Willey made a motion that the same rate be kept. Seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.

It was decided that Earl Willey contact Wm. Coverdale about putting storm sewer down Sussex Street. Mr. Lynch was going to see Mr; Hirschbein about having sanitary service to the house he owns on Mechanic Street.
