Mr. Lynch read a letter from Dr. Foster Flint concerning the parking lot that had been discussed at an earlier date, due to the fact that the parking conditions at the school had caused many complaints from residence in that area. He asked the town's support in the cost of such a project,. Mr. Earl Willey told Mr. Lynch that he would go to Dr. Flint that he perhaps he could offer a suggestion whereby they could use stone and it would be much cheaper, than the way they were planning. Mr. Lynch told Mr. Willey to take care of this.

Richard Lewis, told the Board he had been in touch with the Delmarva Drilling Company about making a survey on the needs of water in the town and he was planning a meeting with them this week

T. J. Gray, Jr. had been informed that the Town Police had to take care of stray dogs in Bridgeville, until they could be turned over to the proper authority, as there was not a dog catcher available in our county

Earl Willey and Wm. R. Reynolds plan to fix up the streets just as soon as they can get Delmarva Asphalt Company here.
