

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
Regular Meeting  
September 14, 1970

Meeting called to order by President, Paul A. Lynch at 8:00 P.M.

Members present were Earl C. Willey, Wm. R. Reynolds, T. J. Gray, Jr. and Richard I. Lewis.

Also present was Frankie Adams, who came to discuss the parking had been marked off at his store on the corner of Market and Cannon Streets. They had previously been going in diagonal and the new markings would make them park straight one in back of the other but park on both sides of the street. Mr. Adams objected to this type of parking. There was much discussion about this and Mr. Lynch told Mr. Adams the Board would look into this further and he would be advised as to their decision. At this time Mr. Adams left.

Mr. Lynch asked Earl Willey and Wm. R. Reynolds to look into this. T. J. Gray, Jr. suggested that the State Highway Department be contacted to see if they had any State Laws that would pertain to this parking on our town.

Franklin Fountain and James Evans came to the meeting to talk about parking on Cook Street and also the pool room and lunch counter that was run by Ralph Smack on the corner of Main & Church Sts. They said the conduct of the people going there was not very good and requested the Town Police to do more patrolling over there. Mr. Lynch told them the Town Board would investigate. They then left.

The Board felt Ralph Smack should be contacted, perhaps by letter, and the police should make a visit there occasionally.

Motion was made by Richard Lewis that on Friday nights there should be two policemen on until one (1) P.M.. This was seconded by Earl C. Willey.

Motion was made by Earl Willey that as of 12:00 P.M. on Monday night, September 14, 1970 that Frank Galante be relieved of his duties as Town Alderman and as of 12:01 A. M. Tuesday, September 15, 1970 George H. Torbert, Sr. be hired as Town Alderman. This was seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr. and approved by the Board.

Motion made by Earl C. Willey that Frank Galante be hired as a town policeman as of Tuesday 12:01 AM, September 15, 1970. Seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.

Mr. Lynch discussed the need of a stop sign on the corner of Edgewood and S. Cannon Street, to help cut down the speeding that he had a complaint about on that street.
