Motion made by Richard I. Lewis to pay all bills. Seconded by Wm. R. Reynolds. Approved by the Board.

The Budget of each department was discussed.

Mr. Lynch told the Board that the Town Alderman, George H. Torbert, Sr. had asked for three days off in November and that he would work on Tuesdays, which is his regular day off each week to make up these days. The Board agreed that this would be satisfactory.

A motion was made by T. J. Gray, Jr. that the Alderman do the Clerical work for the Police Dept. This was seconded by Richard I. Lewis and approved by the Board.

Richard I. Lewis made a motion that Sargent Lewis Frampton, who has been paid \$95.00 per week, be raised to \$100.00. That Virgil L. Kinder, whose present salary is \$90.00 per week be raised to \$95.00 and that Mildred Brown whose salary at present is 82.00 be raised to \$90.00. Changes to be effective as of November 12, 1970. Same was seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.

T. J. Gray, Police Commissioner presented and read the following ordinance- Section 524 ---Drinking on the public streets:

It shall be unlawful for anyone to drink on the streets, sidewalks or alleys, or upon any place where Alcoholic Beverages have been purchased.

Whoever violates this section for the first offense, shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 or imprisoned not less than 30 days or both. For each violation thereafter he shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 or be imprisoned not less than 30 days or both.

Whoever violates this section three (3 times) or more within 12 months shall receive 30 days MANADORY Sentence.

Motion made by Richard I. Lewis to adopt this Ordinance. Seconded by Wm. R. Reynolds and approved by the Board.

Motion made by T. J. Gray, Jr. to replace old signs on Mechanic Street beside Scott Furniture Store. Seconded by Richard I. Lewis. Mr. Gray will order the signs.

Mr. Lynch Discussed the work at the Sewer Plant also the waste going into the sewer lines from the Pet Poultry Products, Inc. He told the Board that Mr. Vauski of the Water Pollution Commission was giving this situation careful study and that he recommend a dome be placed over the Filter Trickle to help the odor.

Being no further business meeting adjourned at 9:45 P. M.
