Minutes of Special Meeting September 20, 1956 with all members present. Meeting No. 16

The Board met with Mr. Clark Gardner and Mr. George Miles, Engineers of Clark Gardner Associates, to tour the town and give them some idea as to what must be done to bring our sewage system up to date including the sewage disposal plant. We gave them an outline of what we thought was needed and they are going over the whole plan to be submitted to us later. In going over the plans, Mr. Gardner brought an interesting fact to our attention. Mr. Gardner said that since we were getting Laws Street paved by the state, he was fairly certain they would put in storm drains to our specifications such as they have done in Seaford, Georgetown and Lewes. It was suggested that we get in touch with Mr. T. G. Adams and the State Engineers to accomplish this. Mr. Willey is to contact Mr. Adams to-night and find out what can be done. If they will cooperate it would mean that the main trunk sewers would be taken care of and all the town would have to do is install feeder lines to this trunk, saving the town in the neighborhood of \$75,000.00.

Mr. Short brought the need for new police uniforms to our attention. The uniforms are to be paid for 1/2 by the policemen and 1/2 by the town. Two dollars per week is to be deducted from police payroll until half is paid for.

Meeting adjourned at 10.00 P. M.

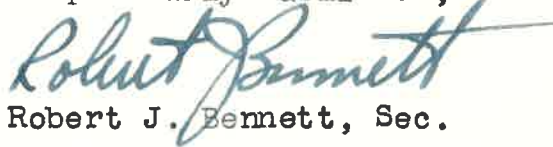
