BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of Bridgeville that: No building, structure, alterations or improvements shall be made upon any real estate within the town limits of Bridgeville by any person, association or corporation without first notifying the office of the town Commissioners, and advertising in the local newspaper for a period of two weeks then obtaining from the office of the Town Commissioners a permit authorizing such building, alterations or improvements. Before the issuance of such permit or permits it shall be determined that said structure, alteration or improvement shall not constitute a nuisance or be detrimental to the general health and welfare of the community. The cost of the permit shall be \$1.00.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the above Ordinance be adopted.

Members present were Earl C. Willey, James E. Culver, John K. Simons, Daniel L. Short and Donald L. Melson.

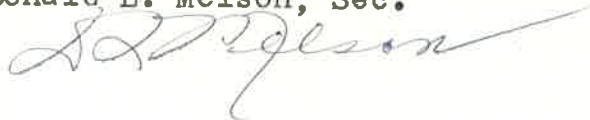
This being a special meeting minutes of last meeting were dispensed with.

follows:

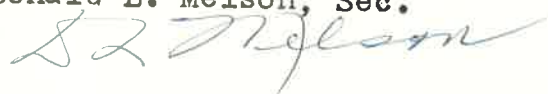

amortising its Sewage Treatment Plant.

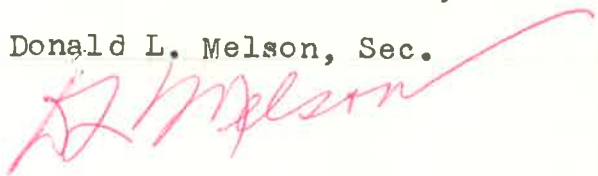
Discussion as to how Bridgeville might set up Sewer tax

Special Meeting #5 March 15, 1961

Special meeting of Town Commissioners and Sewer Advisory Board called to order by John K. Simons at 8:30 P. M.

Town Commissioners present were John K. Simons, Daniel L. Short and Donald L. Melson.

Sewer Advisory Board present were Ira Lewis, R. W. Harris, Edwin L. Layton.

Since this meeting was a special meeting called for the purpose of meeting with Dr. Joel Kaplosky and a member of his staff along with Gardner and Sterling the town's Consulting Engineers, the minutes of the last regular meeting were dispensed with.

Chairman Simons requested Dr. Kaplosky to bring us up to present with a statement outlining the State Water Pollution's position with regards to Bridgeville. Dr. Kaplosky's statement was to the effect that Bridgeville was at the point now where concrete action on the Sewage Disposal Plant System must take place. He recommended that in the very near future a full meeting be held by the Town Council and its Sewer Advisory Board to set up the machinery by which the town council can proceed. Namely that the President of the Town Commissioners be given the authority, by proper resolution, in the minutes of the meeting, to sign all necessary papers to make application to State Water Pollution Department for the federal funds applicable to the Bridgeville proposed system.

Secondly that the Town's legal council be at the meeting to advise on the various legal aspects of this action.

Thirdly that Gardner and Sterling (Town's Consulting Engineers) be advised to proceed with the preparation of forms necessary to making this application.

These recommendations were accepted by all of the town's representatives present.

After these items were cleared discussion comparing total cost of proposed Sewer Plant as compared to a lagoon system took place. Dr. Kaplosky advised that in his opinion there would be very little difference in cost, because a lagoon system would entail a great deal more than simply digging a hole in the ground. He said that studies show that it requires one acre of lagoon for each twenty persons served, plus industrial waste. The lagoon must be made impervious to seepage, be a sufficient distance away, from the town, fenced, policed and grass kept cut. He pointed out also that a lagoon can be very easily thrown out of balance by sudden overloads.

Williams and Allan Jones.

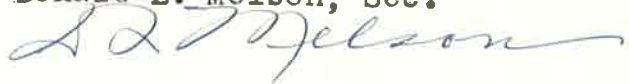
President Culver read a letter from the State Water
