

COMMISSIONERS MEETING
AUGUST 12, 1991
7:00 PM

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT SLATER AT 7:00 PM. COMMISSIONER PRESENT WERE GENE CROCKETT, CHARLES ROYAL, JAMES EVANS, MICHEAL COLLISON.

GUEST PRESENT WERE DARYL TULL, JOHN LOSCOMB, DOUG JONES, PHIL MOWBRAY, PHILLIP DAVIS

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER EVANS AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT TO DISPENSE WITH THE MINUTES FROM THE LAST MEETING. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT SLATER THAT DELAGRA HAS INSTALLED A NEW WAREHOUSE AND A RESOLUTION IS REQUIRED FROM CONRAIL. THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE DOES NOT HAVE TO PAY, BUT THE AGREEMENT MUST HAVE OUR NAME WITH DELAGRA'S ON IT. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER ROYAL TO EXCEPT THE RESOLUTION AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER EVANS. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT SLATER READ THE SECOND READING OF THE FLOOD PLAN ORDINANCE. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER EVANS. APPROVED.

POLICE COMMISSIONER CROCKETT REPORTED THAT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAD 679 ARRESTS FOR THE MONTH OF JULY. ALSO THERE HAS BEEN A LETTER RECEIVED BY THE POLICE COMMISSIONER FROM MR. NICHOLS. THIS IS PERTAINING TO THE TRUCK WEIGHTS WITHIN TOWN LIMITS. CHIEF ORR STATED THAT THE NEW POLICE STATION IS MOVING ALONG AS EXPECTED AND THEY SHOULD BE MOVING BY THE END OF THE MONTH.

COMMISSIONER EVANS STATED THAT WE NEED APPROVAL FOR THE WATER LINE TO BE REPLACED ON JOHN STREET. WE HAVE A LIST A MATERIALS AND THE LABOR NEEDS TO BE CALCULATED. A MOTION WAS MADE TO PURCHASE THE MATERIALS FOR JOHN STREET BY COMMISSIONER EVANS AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER ROYAL. THE AMOUNT IS \$1,938.00. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT SLATER THAT AS SOON AS THE BILLS ARE IN THE REPORTS THERE WILL BE A SPECIAL MEETING FOR APPROVAL.

COMMISSIONER ROYAL STATED THAT THE TOWN IS IN THE PROCESS OF RECEIVING TRASH CONTAINERS TO BE PLACED ALL OVER TOWN. ALSO THEY HAVE BEEN ADVISED TO START REPAIR ON THE STREETS. (CEDAR STREET) AS OF THIS MEETING THEY HAVE NOT BEGAN WORK YET.

DARYL TULL SPOKE THAT CEDAR STREET IS IN VERY BAD CONDITION. HE WANTS TO KNOW IF THIS STREET WOULD BE DONE OR IF IT IS

JUST UNDER CONSIDERATION. THE STATE IS GOING TO PAY FOR JACOBS STREET TO BE REPAVED. A LIST WAS MADE BY THE COMMISSIONERS STARTING WITH THE WORST STREETS TO THE OTHERS. THE PATCHING WILL BE WITH HOT MIX, THERE WILL NOT BE ANYMORE COLD MIX PATCHING. MR. TULL ALSO ASKED IF THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN COULD HAVE AN UPDATE FROM JERRY MARS AS TO THE GRANTS THAT HE HAS APPLIED FOR WITH FMHA. THE PREAPPLICATION HAS BEEN FILED. THE FUNDS WILL BE DISPENSED WITHIN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS. ALSO THESE GRANT FOR SEWER AND WATER LINES. ON THE 29TH OF SEPTEMBER IF THE GRANT IS NOT APPROVED THEN WE MUST REPEAT THE PROCESS OVER AGAIN. JERRY MARS ALSO HAS A LIST OF OTHER NUMEROUS GRANTS THAT WE WILL BE FILING FOR. THERE WAS A MEETING WITH DNREC FOR THE CONSENT ORDER THAT THE TOWN HAS. THERE HAS BEEN A LACK OF COMMUNICATION WITH DNREC. THERE WERE QUESTIONS AS TO WHERE THE WASTE IS GOING. ALSO ICE IS BEING DUMPED INTO THE STORM DRAIN SYSTEM EVERY DAY AND NIGHT. INSIDE OF THIS ICE THERE ARE PARTS OF CHICKENS. PRESIDENT SLATER SAID THAT HE WILL CONTACT DNREC TO CHECK INTO IT. MR. CINA TOLD THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND THE COMMISSIONERS THAT THERE IS A PROBLEM WITH THE CARS IN A SOLID LINE AND ARE PREVENTING HIM FROM TURNING OUT OF THE END OF CEDAR ST. MR. CINA REQUESTED THAT THE A STOP SIGN BE PUT ON MAIN STREET AFTER THE SHORE STOP, HE BELIEVES THAT THIS WOULD SLOW THE TRAFFIC DOWN. COMMISSIONER ROYAL SAID THAT DELDOT SENT HIM A LETTER THAT THE TRAFFIC WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS IS NOT HEAVY ENOUGH TO INSTALL A LIGHT AT THE CORNER OF CANNON STREET AND MARKET STREET.
