

REGULAR MEETING  
AUGUST 14, 1989

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE WAS BROUGHT TO ORDER BY SECRETARY EVANS AT 7:00PM WITH COMMISSIONERS WILLEY, CROCKETT, AND GILEFSKI IN ATTENDANCE, FOLLOWED BY THE FLAG SALUTE. SECRETARY EVANS THEN READ THE MINUTES FROM THE LAST REGULAR MEETING ON JULY 10, 1989 WITH NO ADDITIONS OR CORRECTIONS. BILLS WERE REVIEWED BY EACH COMMISSIONER. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY AND SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI TO PAY ALL BILLS AS PRESENTED. MOTION APPROVED.

FOR INFORMATION:

CABES PROGRESS REPORT ON THE SEWER PLANT REHABILITATION-DR. QAISAUNEE GAVE A REPORT ON THE STATUS OF THE TEMPORARY VARIANCE REQUEST FROM DNREC. HE DOES NOT KNOW WHAT THE HOLDUP IS BUT WILL STAY ON TOP OF THIS. THE PROBLEM WITH THE RAIN WATER WAS ADDRESSED. ALL EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN RECEIVED BUT ALL TRAINING OF THE PERSONNEL HAS NOT BEEN DONE. COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI EMPHASIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF GETTING IN ALL THE TRAINING BEFORE THE TIME SPAN ALLOTTED HAS BEEN USED.

JERRY MARS WAS PRESENT TO REPRESENT THE BRIDGEVILLE KIWANIS CLUB. HE ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS FOR THEIR PARTICIPATION IN A WORKSHOP FOR THE YOUTH IN THIS AREA WHO SHOW AND WANT TO DEVELOP LEADERSHIP POTENTIAL AND SKILLS. THE WORKSHOP AND SERIES OF SESSIONS WILL BE IN THREE PARTS TO BE HELD IN NOVEMBER, ON SATURDAYS, IN 2 HOUR SESSIONS. ALL COMMISSIONERS PRESENT EXPRESSED THEIR APPROVAL AND AGREED TO PARTICIPATE.

SECRETARY EVANS MENTIONED THAT HE HAD BEEN CONTACTED BY THE NATIONAL FEDERATION OF THE BLIND. THEY WILL BE IN FRONT OF THE BRIDGEVILLE IGA FROM 9AM-4PM ON SEPTEMBER 2ND.

FOR APPROVAL:

COMMISSIONER WILLEY THEN REVIEWED THE BIDS FOR THE REPAINTING OF THE WATER TOWER. AFTER DISCUSSION, COMMISSIONER WILLEY MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE BID FROM PAN CONSTRUCTION FROM COLUMBUS, N.J. WHICH WAS \$27,000.00. MOTION SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT. MOTION ALSO INCLUDES THE ALTERNATE BID ALLOWING PAN CONSTRUCTION TO PAINT THE INSIDE ON A WEEKEND (\$30,000.00).

ALDERMAN'S REPORT:

COMMISSIONER CROCKETT SPOKE ON BEHALF OF THE ALDERMAN, CONCERNING THE HANDLING OF THE PAYMENTS ON THURSDAY. FROM NOW ON, ALL PAYMENTS ARE TO BE HANDLED BY ONLY THE ALDERMAN'S COURT. IF ANYONE COMES TO THE FRONT, THEY ARE NOT TO HANDLE ANY MONIES. COMMISSIONER CROCKETT AGAIN ASK FOR APPROVAL OF THE PURCHASE OF TWO NEW CHAIRS FOR THE ALDERMAN COURT AT A COST OF \$857.00. THIS IS TO BE

PURCHASED OUT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT BUDGET. MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED.

FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 531-C WAS HELD BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SECOND READING WILL BE HELD NEXT MONTH. (COPY ATTACHED)

STREET DEPARTMENT:

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI SPOKE ON HIS PROPOSALS FOR REPAVING OF CERTAIN STREETS IN BRIDGEVILLE. COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI MOTIONED THAT DOUG BE GIVEN PERMISSION TO CONTACT THE CONTRACTOR THAT GAVE THE FIGURES AND HAVE THEM IN CONTRACT FORM. SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED. (IF THE FIGURES ARE THE SAME AS GIVEN TO DOUG BY DELMARVA PAVING ON PROPOSAL, THAT THE PAVING BE DONE.)

SEWER DEPARTMENT:

SECRETARY EVANS SPOKE ON ONE PIECE OF INFORMATION REGARDING THE HANDLING AND POSSESSION OF EXTREMELY HAZARDOUS MATERIALS. JOHN LOSCOMB IS TO GET ON THIS, BUT HE FEELS THAT WE DO NOT HAVE THE NEEDED AMOUNT TO FILE A REPORT.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

COMMISSIONER CROCKETT ASKED IF NO LOITERING SIGNS CAN BE POSTED ON PROPERTIES ON FIRST, CHURCH, AND CANNON STREETS. DOUG WILL ORDER SIGNS. APPROVAL THROUGH COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI'S MOTION, WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED.

COMMISSIONER CROCKETT BROUGHT UP THE PROBLEM OF INSURING PROPERTIES AND BELONGINGS OF THE TOWN. GENE ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS TO THINK ABOUT THIS PROBLEM AND ADDRESS IT AT THE NEXT MEETING.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED AT 7:55 PM.
