

MINUTES

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE TOWN BOARD MEETING JUNE 10, 1996 7:00 P.M.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular monthly meeting of the Commissioners of Bridgeville was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Howard Hardesty. Present: Mr. Hardesty, Mr. Gene Crockett, Mr. Bob Slater, Mr. Jack Dalton, Mrs. Margaret Sipple. Meeting began with a salute to the flag.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The reading of the Minutes of May 13, 1996 were dispensed.

Motion: Commissioner Slater; second Commissioner Dalton; motion carried unanimously.

III. APPROVAL OF MONTHLY BILLS

See breakdown per fund attached. Monthly bills do not include salaries. Motion to approve bills was made by Commissioner Slater; second Commissioner Dalton; motion carried unanimously.

IV. PRESIDENT'S REPORTS

A. CORRESPONDENCE

1. A letter was sent to Hopkins Construction concerning work under the guarantee on Church Street.

2. A grant security assistance institute is being held in Conway, MO.

3. A letter was received from the EPA concerning the proposed permit limit revision regarding pretreatment for Pet Poultry. There are no problems.

4. A police officer has been summoned to Court of Common Pleas concerning animal control violation on Monday, June 24, 1996 at 9:00 a.m. Patrolman Ackenbrack is to appear.

5. Information was received regarding the elimination of Town Aldermans by legislation. Some towns are generating Panel Courts instead of Alderman Courts. They have the same powers as Justice of the Peace Courts.

6. A workshop on hurricanes will be held on Tuesday, June 11, 1996.

7. The Dagsboro Church of God is having a county wide 4th of July celebration. The Council has been invited to attend.

8. The town map sponsored by businesses was put on hold last year and postponement is continued for 1996.

B. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

1. Project Update - Presented by Hans Medlarz of Davis, Bowen, & Friedel.

a. Paving on Main Street is continuing. The base has been installed. Between Elliott and Jacobs, the grades were changed per the contractor's request to avoid paving the intersection due to traffic. Minor adjustments will be done on the catch basins. By the Progress Meeting on June 18, 1996, the finalization on Main Street should be completed. Main Street is expected to be open by the weekend of June 15, 1996. Cherry Alley will be paved. The writing that was carved into the wet cement is to be removed. There is a punch list of several items that still need to be completed, but all will be done.

b. Mr. Medlarz requested a delay of one month before advertising for bids on the sewer plant project. He believes both projects can be wrapped up by July 4, 1996. Then they will be able to determine what funds are still available for use. Estimates for sewer improvements are \$640,000 as it stands to date. Water improvements are \$115,000. Adding these two figures plus the forecast of other expenses connected with the project, it appears we are \$16,000 over budget. When considering this to be a \$4.5 million project, the amount over budget seems to be relatively close.

2. Police - Monthly report is attached. Presented by Chief Orr. If an additional officer is hired by the town under the 3-year federal grant, the federal government will pay the Town of Bridgeville for the first year \$20,000. The Town will have to pay \$1500. The second year the federal government will pay \$17,000 for that officer, and the Town will have to pay \$5000. In the third year the federal government will pay \$13,000, and the Town will have to pay \$9,916. This will include salary,

benefits, Blue Cross insurance, and pension. Equipment may be included, but Chief Orr was not sure without further checking. Chief Orr recommended to put in for two officers, because this is the last grant that will be made available. If two officers are not needed, one could be declined by the Town at the time of the grant.

3. Sewer - Monthly report is attached. Presented by Commissioner Slater. At McDonald's there have been some problems with poles. Delmarva Power is to check the tower on Thursday, June 13, 1996. There have been two prices received on the cleaning of the digester. Phillip Mowbray is to get one more price. We have two 15 HP air compressors. One went bad approximately a year ago. The second compressor has been having trouble in the last month. A new 7.5 HP air compressor was purchased. Part of it is to be paid out of the Sinking Fund. The cost was \$4902 and includes an \$800 trade-in on the other one.

Motion was made to purchase this air compressor was made by Commissioner Slater; second by Commissioner Crockett. Motion was unanimously carried.

3. Water - Monthly report is attached. Presented by Commissioner Dalton. A large amount of time has been explaining to customers the way rates are computed. Adjustments have been made on ones that were found to have leaks. The owner of the property at Shore Stop has hooked up the lines to all the stores located there, so water is not totally running to the Shore Brite Laundry Mat. The new meters were hooked up approximately June 7, 1996 to each of those locations.

4. Streets - No report was given. President Hardesty asked Commissioner Sipple to contact the State people and request the holes on Church Street be filled. He also requested that she contact Rick Passwaters and have cold patch put on some of the alleys. The 200 block of Pine Alley and Chestnut Alley were badly in need of repairs. He also noted that some of the crosswalks in Town were going to need to be addressed in the future.

5. Alderman's Court - Monthly report is attached. Some of the other towns which have an alderman's court are also scaling back the alderman's hours. At this time they are not disbanding the courts until there is more disclosure as to what is going to be done by the State.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. President Hardesty addressed the issue of setting a date for the election for annexation of property. He recommended the date be set sometime around the 15th of August 1996. The Commissioners were in agreement with this.

B. The first reading of Ordinance #1796, AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CODIFICATION OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, INTO A MUNICIPAL CODE TO BE DESIGNATED "THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE" was read.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Commissioner Dalton discussed the Citizen's Coalition that was formed to try to get a moratorium on new construction and commercial buildings. Two areas of consideration is the traffic on Rt. 1 in the Lewes area and the Wal-Mart that is trying to go in at Five Points. The Sussex County Council has backed Del Dot in saying that all parking lots of new construction must be interconnected so as not to force people to go out onto Rt. 1 to go from location to location. The Town of Bridgeville will also have to provide service roads and parking lot interconnections when any businesses decide to build along Rt. 13.

B. President Hardesty explained that the drum was going bad on the Town's photocopier. Commissioner Sipple called and received quotes from several businesses. Prices range between \$2500 and \$3400 for a new copier. Brands quoted included Xerox, Toshiba, and Canon.

Motion was made to purchase a new copier (price not to exceed \$3000) by Commissioner Slater; second Commissioner Crockett. Motion carried unanimously.

C. A letter was received from Dept. of Environmental Control which needs to be signed for the Mosquito Control Agreement. This is required each year.

Motion was made to endorse the Mosquito Control Agreement by Commissioner Slater; second Commissioner Dalton. Motion carried unanimously.

D. President Hardesty met with Mike Williams, District Manager for Marcus Cable that began negotiations on our franchise agreement. A sample copy of the agreement was provided to the Commissioners. Normally it is 5% of what they charge for their normal offerings. The Town would receive a fee for this semi-annually if we so choose. We are also allowed 5 free drops if we desire such as the Library or High School. This can be put into the agreement. This can be renewed any time up to 1999. However, there is some litigation upcoming on this, so it may be wise to decide as soon as possible.

E. The street light inventory was furnished for each Commissioner. (See attached). It is all based on luminas

not wattage. President Hardesty would like some brighter lights put into certain areas. This would not be any more costly. The whole fixture would need to be replaced. A request was made by a citizen to also consider light pollution. A suggestion was made to contact Chief Orr for input as to where he feels the most need would be for added lighting.

F. A suggestion was made by Watha Hostetler to move the meter reading date to the 20th of each month beginning July 1996. The Commissioners concurred with this suggestion.

VII. CITIZENS PRIVILEGE

A. Daryl Tull paid \$303.42 for the additional 4" sidewalk. He requested a copy of all bills that were mailed to others who had the extended sidewalk installed. He was concerned because he did not believe he should have been charged this amount.

B. Vivian Wilson of Shore Brite questioned the exact date of the new meters installed at the Shore Stop property. Commissioner Dalton was to check with Doug Jones and answer her question.

She also questioned the Commissioners whether they expected to install a commercial rate for water usage. Commissioner Dalton explained that he had questioned the Town Officials about that and was told that it was in the referendum that there would be one rate and the Town was pressured by the State to have one rate. Commissioner Slater explained that this was a fairer way to all customers. He further explained that the owner of the laundry mat before her did receive a letter stating what the new rates would be. Apparently this information had not been relayed to her at the time she purchased the laundry mat. She therefore questioned whether she had any recourse against the realtor or the previous owner. The Commissioners advised her to speak with an attorney about this matter.

She then questioned if there was any way she could avoid having the water treated by the sewer plant. The Commissioners explained that all water must be treated, even rain water.

VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Motion was made to go into Executive Session at 9:30 p.m. by Commissioner Sipple; second Commissioner Slater. Motion was carried unanimously.

The Commissioners returned to the regular meeting at 9:50 p.m. No motions were made during the Executive Session.

IX. ADJOURNMENT

Motion was made by Commissioner Slater to adjourn at 9:51 p.m. and was seconded by Commissioner Sipple. Motion was carried unanimously.

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE SPECIAL TOWN BOARD MEETING

JUNE 24, 1996

7:00 P.M.

I. CALL TO ORDER

This Special meeting of the Commissioners of Bridgeville was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Howard Hardesty. Present: Mr. Hardesty, Mr. Gene Crockett, Mr. Bob Slater, Mr. Jack Dalton, Mrs. Margaret Sipple.

II. AGENDA:

Resolution authorizing and providing for the sale of \$1,967,200 General Obligation Bonds (\$829,100 General Obligation Bond (Water Improvements Project) and \$1,138,100 General Obligation Bond (Sewer Improvements Project) to provide for permanent financing for modifications and improvements to the Sanitary Sewer Treatment and Water systems including the refinancing of interim financing incurred in connection therewith. This is in regards to borrowing money from Farmer's Home.

III. INTRODUCTION OF HAL SAMMONS:

President Hardesty introduced Hal Sammons of Potter, Anderson and Corroon, who represents Bridgeville as Bond council, and turned the meeting over to him. Mr. Sammons explained what a bond council does. He went on to explain that in 1993 there was an issuance of the Bond to finance the Water and Sewer improvements. There was a letter of conditions from Farmer's Home which is now known as Rural Utility Service ("RUS"). A form of Resolution and a form of bonds was submitted to the RUS. There was a referendum held and approval for up to \$2.5 million of debt for the projects. Under the letter of commitment, RUS approved the loan to finance the projects. Under their regulations the Town of Bridgeville was required to obtain interim financing. This was done with Baltimore Trust. It is now time to obtain the permanent financing. Mr. Sammons reviewed the resolutions allowing for the referendum for the sale of the bonds, the application for and receipt of the letter of commitment from RUS, and the temporary financing from Baltimore Trust. Mr. Sammons then explained the permanent

financing from RUS would be in the form of two separate bonds - Bond A and Bond B totaling \$1,967,200. One for Water and one for Sewer projects. Each one will bear an interest rate of 4.5% per annum for 40 years payable quarterly (September 25, December 25, March 25 and June 25. The quarterly installment on the \$829,100 bond will be \$11,202.00 and the quarterly installment on the \$1,138,100 bond will be \$15,376.00. The principal and interest on each bond if not paid for from the sewer and water fees shall be paid for by the raising of tax rates. Each bond must have a registered owner, shall be issued pursuant to the Town's charter and signed by the President and Secretary of the Town Commission. They may be prepaid without penalty. The Town has acknowledged the sale of these bonds to RUS complying to the tax laws. There is a designation under the tax law that may allow banks to hold these bonds. The final part of the Resolution states that the President and Secretary are empowered to approve the sale of the bonds. Adoption of the Resolution will approve the form of the two bonds that are set forth and attached. The Town has been working with their engineers to establish rates from the water and sewer billings to service this debt.

IV. DISCUSSION OF THE ISSUE:

President Hardesty asked if there were any questions on the issue. The terms were reviewed by Commissioner Dalton. The terms of another sewer bond were discussed. President Hardesty discussed the income from the Water and Sewer billings. Mr. Sammons stated that the Town had been helped by RUS to come up with a budget for repayment. There was a 55% grant of \$4,200,000 on the total cost of the projects. President Hardesty stated that if there were no further questions, he would hear motions to approve or disapprove the Resolution for the sale of the bonds. Commissioner Dalton moved to accept the Resolution authorizing the sale of \$1,967,200 of General Obligation bonds of which \$829,100 is for water improvements and \$1,138,100 for sewer improvements as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Slater. President Hardesty asked for further discussion. As there was none, there was a vote on the motion. The motion to authorize the sale of the bonds was unanimously passed.

V. NEW BUSINESS:

There was a discussion of the ordering of 10,000 forms for the billing of Water and Sewer charges. The cost of the forms will be \$66.75 per thousand. The Commissioners reviewed the new forms.

President Hardesty also stated that he had been asked if there were any way to hook up water to the proposed new playground going in on Market Street. After discussion of

the matter it was decided that the Town would provide a hookup to the new playground.

Commissioner Dalton stated that he had been asked by Jimmy Tennefoss of Jimmy's Grille if there would be an impact fee to hook up to the Town water supply. Commissioner Slater said that the Town water line did not go out that far. It stops at the edge of Town.

VI. EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Motion was made by Commissioner Sipple to go into Executive Session at 7:20 p.m. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Dalton. Motion was carried unanimously. The Commissioners returned to the regular meeting at 9:05 p.m. No motions were made during the Executive Session.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT:

Commissioner Slater made a motion that the meeting be adjourned at 9:10 p.m. Commissioner Dalton seconded the motion. It was unanimously carried.

COMMISSIONER'S MEETING

JUNE 10, 1996

Water Department:

For the month of May we pumped a total of 3,961,000 gallons of water.

We have all but about four of the new meters installed.

We made adjustments for some people who had concerns about the amount of water and sewer they were being charged for. In most all cases it was a leak that caused their bill to be high, so we advised them to fix the leaks and then we adjusted their bills for the sewer charge. Most of these have been addressed, but we expect to see some new ones when the new bills are sent.

The owner of the Shore Stop shopping center has installed the lines so that each location now has its own meter. The meters have been tested and marked for each location.

SCAT:

There has been a lobbying effort by a group called Citizens Coalition regarding the congestion on Rt.#1 in Rehoboth and Lewes. They have asked County Council and SCAT to support a moratorium on all commercial construction until the Comprehensive Use Plan could be put into effect.

We countered with the fact that some of the towns on the western side of the county were trying to attract business to their areas and a moratorium would interfere with needed growth.

Rehoboth has written to County Council supporting the moratorium, Dewey Beach took the position of encouraging Council to enforce all existing zoning laws (they purposely refrained from mentioning a moratorium), and Lewes said they would not support a moratorium due to its impact on towns in the west.

County Council has voted to not impose said moratorium, but instead are working with DELDOT to insure any new construction makes plans for service roads and interconnects with stores.

Dear George

Thank you for including me on the agenda of the Sussex County Association of Towns meeting on June 5 in Fenwick Island. The group was very attentive and I believe that they took seriously my request for a limited moratorium on all commercial construction and rezonings until the Land Use Plan is approved and becomes law.

Last night I failed to mention that the Citizens Coalition consists of citizens from throughout the County. Our membership includes households from Milton, Bridgeville, Bethany and Millsboro as well as from Lewes, Rehoboth, Dewey Beach and Angola.

A moratorium is a valuable tool in any land-use planning process. It gives county planners and town officials an opportunity to provide valuable input into this process without any outside pressures to make land-use decisions which could defeat the planning effort. One thing we've also been advocating is that towns share responsibility with the county within a two-mile radius of a town's boundary. This would allow a town to better control its growth as well as its fate.

Ultimately we would like SCAT to draft a letter to Sussex County Council expressing support for responsible land use in Sussex County. In it we'd like SCAT to request that County Council declare a *limited* moratorium on commercial construction and rezonings for the remaining six months of 1996 or until the Comprehensive Land Use Plan is in place.

As such this *limited* moratorium would only affect commercial development from the County line at Milford to the Maryland-Delaware State line and from the Delaware Bay and Atlantic Ocean on the east to within two miles west of Route 113.

As I said last night, we are in favor of growth. But growth without a plan equals sprawl, and sprawl undermines economic well being and in the long-run has a negative impact on an area. I would be pleased to discuss the moratorium or any other aspect of our request if you or the steering committee wishes.
