

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 10, 1990

MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI AT 7:00 PM.

COMMISSIONER'S PRESENT WERE GILEFSKI, EVANS, SLATER AND WILLEY.

GUESTS PRESENT WERE JOHNNIE BANKS, CHUCK ROYAL, WALTER MARS, THELEADER, JOHN LOSCOMB, NELSON CROCKET, CLIFTON JACKSON, JOHN NICHOLAS, BEVERLY ALLEN, MYRA NEAL, DOUG JONES, PHILLIP MOWBRAY, CHIEF ORR, NORMAN OATES, AND MILDRED PUSEY.

THE READING OF THE LAST MEETINGS MINUTES WERE READ BY COMMISSIONER EVANS. MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO APPROVE THE MINUTES AS READ.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER EVANS TO PAY ALL BILLS FOR THE MONTH.

THERE WAS A DISCUSSION AS TO THE PRETREATMENT COSTS AND VIOLATIONS MADE BY SHORE BEST POULTRY. THE LAST MONTHLY REPORT FROM SHORE BEST WAS TEN DAYS LATE. THE COMPANY CAN NOT BE SENT A BILL UNTIL THE MONTHLY REPORT IS RECEIVED.

AFTER DISCUSSING ALL ASPECTS OF THE VIOLATIONS, A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO FINE SHORE BEST POULTRY, INC. ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER VIOLATION FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER AND TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS PER VIOLATION FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, THEN TO BE PROGRESSED PER MONTH UNTIL CORRECTIONS ARE MADE. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI STATED THAT THERE WAS A REQUEST LAST MONTH FROM ISDELL SANITATION TO HAUL SEPTIC WASTE INTO THE BRIDGEVILLE PLANT. MR. ISDELL HAULED WASTE HERE IN THE PREVIOUS YEARS. ALSO THERE WAS A REQUEST FROM DONALD JONES. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER EVANS AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO APPROVE THE WASTE DISCHARGE PERMITS TO BOTH MR. ISDELL AND MR. JONES. APPROVED.

ALDERMAN'S REPORT-

WASTE TREATMENT-COMMISSIONER EVANS STATED THAT WE SHOULD INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF CHARGES AT THE WASTE TREATMENT PLANT. FROM FIFTEEN DOLLARS PER THOUSAND GALLONS TO THIRTY DOLLARS PER THOUSAND GALLONS. THIS WOULD GIVE THE TOWN MORE REVENUE, AND ALSO INCREASE THE FEES FOR THE PRIVATE HAULERS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER EVANS TO RAISE AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SLATER. APPROVED.

COMMISSIONER EVANS ALSO SAID THAT THEY ARE STILL GETTING PRICES FOR THE GREEN HOUSE AT THE PLANT. THEY ARE TRYING TO GET THE BEST PRICES BEFORE MAKING A DECISION . THERE WAS A DISCUSSION ABOUT MCDONALD'S HAVING PROBLEMS WITH THERE GREASE TRAPS. HOPEFULLY THIS WILL BE CORRECTED SOON. THE REPLACEMENT OF THE COMMON NEUTORS HAS NOT BEEN STARTED YET.


CITIZEN'S PRIVILEGE-PRESIDENT GILEFSKI HAD IN HAND A PETITION THAT WAS SIGNED BY FIFTY-FIVE PEOPLE PROTESTING THAT BIRCH STREET WAS MADE ONE WAY. THIS PETITION WAS GIVEN TO THE COMMISSIONERS BY MR. CLIFTON JACKSON. THERE WAS A DISCUSSION AS TO THIS BEING AN ALLEY INSTEAD OF A STREET. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI TOLD THEM THAT IT IS A STREET. AT THE LAST MEETING IT WAS BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION THAT THE STREET WAS VERY NARROW AND IT WAS VIRTUALLY IMPOSSIBLE FOR TWO CARS TO PASS EACH OTHER. MR. ROYAL AND MR. CROCKET HAD A CONFLICT BETWEEN THEM AS TO WHY THIS SHOULD OR SHOULD NOT BE A ONE WAY STREET. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS TO APPOINT SOMEONE TO CHECK INTO THE DIFFERENT ASPECTS AS TO CHANGING THE ONE WAY OF BIRCH STREET. COMMISSIONER SLATER STATED THAT HE IS STILL IN FAVOR OF KEEPING BIRCH STREET ONE WAY. MANY OF THE PEOPLE ON THE PETITION DO NOT LIVE ON BIRCH STREET. COMMISSIONER SLATER AND THE CHIEF OF POLICE, HANDLEY ORR WILL BE HAVING A MEETING PERTAINING TO THE STREET.

MR NICHOLS STATED THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS HAS RECEIVED OUR LETTER AND WILL BE ACTING ON IT SOON. HE TOLD THE COMMISSIONERS THANK YOU FOR SUBMITTING THE LETTER.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI THANKED COMMISSIONER WILLEY FOR SERVING ON THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SLATER TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION AT 8:15 PM.
