

REGULAR MEETING
COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
JANUARY 8, 1990

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE WAS BROUGHT TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI AT 7:12 PM. THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE WAS THEN HELD. THE FIRST ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS THE READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE LAST REGULAR MEETING AND THE SPECIAL MEETING FROM DECEMBER 20TH. COMMISSIONER TULL MOVED THAT WE DISPENSE WITH THE READING OF THE REGULAR MEETING, BUT TO APPROVE THEM AS WRITTEN; TO HAVE THE READING OF THE MINUTES FROM THE SPECIAL MEETING. SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED. COMMISSIONER EVANS THEN READ THE MINUTES. ONE CORRECTION NOTED--JOHN TYNDALL BE GIVEN THREE WEEKS OF HIS VACATION, INSTEAD OF THREE DAYS, AS READ. MOTIONED BY COMMISSIONER TULL, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO APPROVE THE MINUTES AS AMENDED. SO CARRIED.

THE NEXT ITEM ON AGENDA WAS THE APPROVAL OF THE BILLS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER EVANS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO APPROVE PAYMENT OF BILLS. SO CARRIED.

THE WINNERS OF THE CHRISTMAS DECORATING CONTEST WERE ANNOUNCED: FIRST PLACE WAS MS. MYRNA NEAL OF FIRST STREET; SECOND PLACE WENT TO MS. LINDA DEIBEL OF DELAWARE AVENUE; THIRD PLACE WENT TO MS. BOOTSIE SIPPLE OF SUSSEX AVENUE.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI THEN APPOINTED HIS COMMISSIONERS TO THEIR DEPARTMENTS: COMMISSIONER TULL TO POLICE COMMISSIONER; COMMISSIONER EVANS TO SEWER COMMISSIONER; COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO WATER COMMISSIONER; AND COMMISSIONER SLATER TO STREET COMMISSIONER.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI THEN ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS FOR THEIR REPORTS. COMMISSIONER TULL MENTIONED THE FACT THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE EACH COMMISSIONER NAME 2 INDIVIDUALS TO SERVE ON AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO GENERATE DIFFERENT IDEAS AND ENHANCE BRIDGEVILLE IN DIFFERENT AREAS.

COMMISSIONER EVANS REPORTED THAT WE ARE GETTING NEW ULTRA-VIOLET LIGHTS FOR THE WASTE TREATMENT PLANT. COMMISSIONER WILLEY REPORTED THAT THERE ARE A FEW WATER LEAKS AROUND TOWN AND THEY WILL BE TAKEN CARE OF WHEN THE WEATHER BREAKS. COMMISSIONER SLATER STATED THAT HE HAD SEVERAL COMPLAINTS ABOUT VOTING IRREGULARITIES DURING THE LAST ELECTION. HE FEELS THAT WE NEED TO LOOK INTO IT. MR. SLATER THEN MADE A MOTION TO SET UP A COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE PROBLEMS AND HE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO CHAIR THAT COMMITTEE. MOTION SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO APPROVED. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI APPOINTED MR. EVANS AND MR. WILLEY, PLUS DENNIS SCHRADER TO SERVE WITH MR. SLATER.

ALDERMAN REPORT- IN WRITTEN FORM AND PRESENTED TO EACH COMMISSIONER (COPY ATTACHED TO MINUTES)

POLICE REPORT- IN WRITTEN FORM TO EACH REPORT.

CITIZEN'S PRIVILEGE-AL RIZZO FROM MARKET STREET ASKED THE STATUS OF THE COMMUNITY BLOCK GRANT MONEY. COMMISSIONER TULL ADDED THAT THERE WERE DIFFICULTIES THE LAST TIME THIS WAS DONE. THERE WERE SEVERAL PROBLEMS INCURRED AT THE TIME THE SURVEYS WERE DONE. COMMISSIONER TULL COMMENTED THAT HE FEELS WE NEED TO GET MORE INFORMATION, BECAUSE POSSIBLY THERE ARE CERTAIN LIMITATIONS ON THESE GRANTS. IT IS NOT NECESSARILY A FREE PROGRAM. MR. CHARLES ROYAL ALSO SPOKE, STATING THAT THE PROGRAM SOUNDED WONDERFUL AT FIRST, BUT THE MORE INVOLVED YOU GOT, THE LESS APPEALING IT SOUNDED. HE STATED THAT IF YOU BECOME INVOLVED IN THE PROGRAM, THAT YOUR PROPERTY WOULD BE TIED UP FOR 10 YEARS, WHICH WOULD BE BAD FOR PROPERTY INVESTORS. COMMISSIONER TULL THEN ADDED THAT HE UNDERSTANDS THAT THE WHOLE PROGRAM HAS BEEN PUT ON HOLD, AS THERE ARE NO FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE. COMMISSIONER TULL ADDED THAT HE WOULD TAKE THIS ON AS A PROJECT AND TRY TO HAVE SOMEONE COME OVER TO EXPLAIN THE PROGRAM TO THE RESIDENTS.

MR. CINA FROM ELM STREET SPOKE ON THE PROBLEM WITH THE LAVERTY LANES COMPLEX HAVING 2 FAMILY DWELLINGS WITH ONLY ONE EXIT.



A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER TULL, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO REMOVE CONSTANCE COLLINS FROM THE POSITION OF ALDERMAN. SO CARRIED WITH COMMISSIONERS TULL, EVANS, WILLEY AND GILEFSKI VOTING YEA AND COMMISSIONER SLATER VOTING NAY. MOTION CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER TULL, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER EVANS TO REMOVE NINA PATTON FROM THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT ALDERMAN. SO CARRIED WITH COMMISSIONERS TULL, EVANS, WILLEY AND GILEFSKI VOTING YEA AND COMMISSIONER SLATER VOTING NAY. MOTION CARRIED.
BEING THERE WAS NO FURTHER BUSINESS FROM THE REGULAR MEETING, THE REGULAR MEETING WAS FORMALLY ADJOURNED AT 10:20
