

REGULAR MEETING
COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE

JULY 10, 1989
7:00 PM

THE MONTHLY MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE WAS BROUGHT TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT MICHAEL COLLISON AT 7:05 PM ON MONDAY, JULY 10, 1989. PRESIDENT COLLISON LED THE FLAG SALUTE. THE FIRST ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS THE READING OF THE MINUTES FROM THE JUNE MONTHLY MEETING. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI TO DISPOSE OF THE READING. MOTION CARRIED. APPROVAL OF BILLS WAS THEN DISCUSSED. AFTER REVIEW, A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER EVANS TO PAY ALL BILLS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI; MOTION CARRIED.

CABE'S PROGRESS REPORT ON SEWER REHABILITATION-DR. QAISAUNEE REPORTED THAT A LETTER WAS SENT TO LANCE ELLER REGARDING THEIR FULFILLING THE REQUIREMENTS IN THE CONTRACT TO DEMONSTRATE 1800 GALLONS PER MINUTE CAPACITY. A REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY EMERGENCY VARIANCE TO PERMIT LANCE ELLER TO DO THE WORK NEEDED HAS BEEN SENT TO THE DNREC. A MEETING HAS BEEN SET FOR THIS WEDNESDAY, JULY 12, TO SEE WHAT IS INVOLVED BEFORE THEY ISSUE THE PERMIT. THE LABORATORY EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN INSTALLED AND IS COMPLETE. TWO 1/2 DAYS OF TRAINING HAVE BEEN SCHEDULED FOR NEXT WEEK. JOE GANNON WILL BE DOWN ON JULY 17 AND JULY 22 TO TRAIN ON THE LAB EQUIPMENT.

THE NEXT ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE TOWN CLEAN-UP DAY TO BE HELD ON JULY 29TH AND AUGUST 5TH FOR THE RAIN DATE. ALL PRODUCTS FOR PICNIC HAVE BEEN LINED UP. ALL COMMISSIONERS AND TOWN EMPLOYEES WERE ASKED TO PARTICIPATE ON THAT DAY. TRASH BAGS WILL BE PURCHASED BY THE TOWN AND WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE STREET REPRESENTATIVES ON THAT DAY.

THE SNOW HILL JOUSTING COMPETITION ON AUGUST 13TH WAS DISCUSSED. PRESIDENT COLLISON ASKED FOR THE OTHER COMMISSIONERS TO PARTICIPATE.

FOR APPROVAL- THE SECOND READING OF THE ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE #548 AND 548A. ORDINANCE #548B-THIS ORDINANCE WAS THEN READ. DULY ADOPTED. (COPY ATTACHED)

THE REQUEST FOR BIDS FOR THE STORAGE BUILDING. MATERIAL WAS GIVEN TO EACH COMMISSIONER. COMMISSIONER EVANS MOVED TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT. SO CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WILLEY THEN ASKED ABDUL IF THE CHANGES ON THE TOWER FROM 150,000 GALLONS TO 125,000 GALLONS. COMMISSIONER WILLEY REPORTED THAT ONE COMPANY HAD INSPECTED THE TOWER. HE ALSO ASK FOR DISCUSSION ON WEEKEND WORK ON THE TOWER INSTEAD

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OF SHUTTING DOWN THE TOWER FOR 3 TO 4 WEEKS. ADBUL
ADDRESSED THE QUESTION AND SAID THIS COULD BE TAKEN UP WITH
THE WINNING BIDDER.

ALDERMAN'S REPORT-A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER
CROCKETT, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. SO MOVED. (COPY

COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS

POLICE DEPARTMENT-COMMISSIONER CROCKETT REPORTED THAT A
TOTAL OF \$1000.00 HAS BEEN RECEIVED FROM THE COMMUNITY
TOWARDS THE DRUG PROGRAM. A REQUEST FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO
NEW CHAIRS AT A COST OF \$1178.00 FOR THE ALDERMAN COURT WAS
DENIED. COMMISSIONER CROCKETT ALSO ASKED IF RESIDENTS
OUTSIDE OF THE TOWN LIMITS WILL BE ABLE TO TIE INTO THE MALL
SEWER LINE. THE CONSENSUS FROM THE COMMISSIONERS AND TOWN
EMPLOYEES IS THAT A TIME PERIOD FOR ANALYSIS OF THE
OPERATION OF THE NEW LINE BE ESTABLISHED. COMMISSIONERS
EVANS AND WILLEY SUGGESTED A PERIOD OF 6 MONTHS WATCHTIME
WITH DOUG AND CABE BEING THE TWO THAT WILL HAVE THE FINAL
SAY AS TO WHEN RESIDENTS MAY TIE IN.

DISCUSSION WAS HELD ON THE WAVING OF THE IMPACT FEE FOR THE
BRIDGEVILLE GROUP HOME TO CONNECT TO OUR SEWER LINE. SO
MOTIONED BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER
WILLEY. MOTION CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER CROCKETT TALKED ABOUT THE IDEA OF DISCONNECTING
FROM THE WATER SERVICE THOSE RESIDENTS WHO HAVE MADE NO
ATTEMPT TO PAY TAXES. COMMISSIONER EVANS ADDED THAT HE FELT
THAT THE TOWN HAD NO RIGHT TO TURN OFF SERVICE TO PEOPLE.
COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI ALSO SPOKE, SAYING THAT HE FELT THIS
IS A GOOD WAY TO GET SOMETHING DONE. COMMISSIONER CROCKETT
MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY THAT THOSE
WHO ARE DELINQUENT IN PAYING THEIR TAXES AND HAVE NOT MADE
ANY ATTEMPT TO PAY, HAVE THEIR WATER CUT OFF, THE FIRST STEP
BEFORE SENDING THEIR NAME TO DENNIS SCHRADER FOR SALE OF
PROPERTY. SO MOVED, WITH COMMISSIONER EVANS VOTING NO.

WATER DEPARTMENT-COMMISSIONER WILLEY REPORTED THAT THE BIDS
FOR THE WATER TOWER WILL BE OPENED ON JULY 20TH.
COMMISSIONER WILLEY WILL BE HERE AT THAT TIME. LANCE ALSO
REPORTED THAT THE WATER DEPARTMENT HAS PURCHASED A MAGNETIC
WATER METER LOCATER.

SEWER DEPARTMENT-COMMISSIONER EVANS REPORTED THAT THE PLANT
IS WORKING VERY WELL.

STREET DEPARTMENT-COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI REPORTED THAT THE
JOHN DEERE NEEDS A NEW DECK OR WE NEED TO TRADE THE TRACTOR
EVEN-UP FOR A NEW BUSHOG. MOTIONED BY COMMISSIONER
GILEFSKI, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER EVANS. SO MOVED.
COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI ALSO REPORTED ON THE NORTH CANNON
STREET, WHICH IS THE STREET THAT NEEDS THE MOST ATTENTION AT

THIS TIME. AFTER MUCH IT WAS DECIDED THAT WE WOULD HOLD OFF UNTIL DOUG CAN OBTAIN PRICES FROM THE STATE AND GEORGE AND LYNCH, WHO WILL BE IN TOWN DOING ALTERNATE 13, NORTH AND SOUTH. COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI ALSO COMMENDED DOUG ON THE JOB OF FIXING THE BUMPS ON WALNUT AND EDGEWOOD STREETS.

AFTER COMMENTS BY R. FRANCIS ADAMS CONCERNING THE NEW HOUSING PROJECT AND THE CONDITION OF THE STREETS IN TOWN, COMMISSIONER EVANS MOVED AND COMMISSIONER WILLEY SECONDED TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION. SO MOVED.

THE COMMISSIONERS CAME OUT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION at 9:10pm.
