

COMMISSIONERS MEETING
NOVEMBER 12, 1990
7:00 PM

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE WAS BROUGHT TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI AT 7:00 PM. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONERS TULL, WILLEY, SLATER. GUESTS PRESENT WERE JOHN LOSCOMB, PHILLIP MOWBRAY, NORMAN OATES, chief ORR, JERRY MARS, CHARLES ROYAL, JOHN NICHOLS, VERA SMACK, GAIL POE, ETHEL WEAL, DANNY OF THE IGA, MILDRED PUSEY.

BILLS WERE PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT, AFTER A SHORT REVIEW BY ALL OF THE COMMISSIONERS A MOTION WAS MADE TO PAY ALL BILLS. SO APPROVED.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI THEN READ A LETTER THAT HE HAD RECEIVED FROM MR. WINSKI PERTAINING TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SPEAKING TO THE STUDENTS AT THE SCHOOLS. OFFICER OATES AND PARSONS GAVE A PRESENTATION AT THE SCHOOL BEFORE halloween.

THE FIRE DEPARTMENT PRESENTED A LETTER FOR THE REQUEST FOR FUNDS. THE BRIDGEVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT IS REQUESTING A DONATION OF \$5,000.00 FROM THE COMMISSIONERS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER TULL TO GRANT THE DONATION TO THE FIRE COMPANY. SO APPROVED.

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI THEN STATED THAT THERE IS A REQUEST FOR A WASTE HAULERS PERMIT FOR MR. HENRY DUKES. THERE WAS A DISCUSSION AS TO WHAT KIND OF WASTE WILL BE DUMPED FROM THE PEOPLE APPLYING FOR NEW PERMITS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER TO APPROVE THE PERMIT. MOTION FAILED FOR THE LACK OF A SECOND.

ALDERMAN'S REPORT-PRESENTED FOR OBSERVATION.

POLICE REPORT-COMMISSIONER TULL STATED THAT THERE WERE NOT ANY REPORTED INSTANCES ON MISCHIEF NIGHT OR HALLOWEEN. THE UPDATE ON THE DRUG ARREST, THERE HAS BEEN THREE PEOPLE TRIED AND ALL THREE HAVE BEEN CONVICTED ON ALL COUNTS IN THE FEDERAL COURT. THE ADAM PROGRAM IS NOW IN PROGRESS. AFTER TWO MONTHS OF THE NORTH SIDE COMMUNITY WATCH THERE HAS NOT BEEN ANY REPORTED CRIME. THERE WILL BE NEW COMMUNITY WATCH SIGNS INSTALLED. THERE WAS A LARGE GAS TANK FOUND UNDERGROUND AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WHEN REPAIRING THE SEWER LINES. THE TANK CONTAINED GASOLINE AND HAD TO BE PUMPED OUT BEFORE THE TANK COULD BE REMOVED.

WASTE TREATMENT-COMMISSIONER EVANS. THE REPORT WAS PRESENTED BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI. DEPSCO WILL BE DOING THE REPAIRS ON THE COMMUNATOR. THE REPAIRS WILL START AS SOON AS THE PARTS

ARE AVAILABLE. JOHN LOSCOMB AND PHILLIP MOWBRAY ATTENDED A SEMINAR AT THE PERDUE PLANT IN GEORGETOWN IN REFERENCE TO ULTRA VIOLET LAMPS WHICH ARE USED AT OUR PLANT. ON OCTOBER 16, 1990 THE STATE INSPECTORS JOE MOROONIE AND STEVE ROMA WERE AT THE SEWER PLANT FOR THE YEARLY INSPECTION. THE INSPECTION TOOK ABOUT THREE HOURS AND THERE WERE NOT ANY DEFICIENCIES REPORTED.


WATER REPORT-COMMISSIONER WILLEY STATED THAT HE AND DOUG ATTENDED A SALE LAST MONTH. THEY PURCHASED A LOT OF INVENTORY. THERE WAS A DISCUSSION DUE TO LATE WATER BILLS. IT HAS BEEN INTO EFFECT FOR ONE YEAR NOW THAT THERE IS A \$25.00 DISCONNECT FEE. THERE IS A REMINDER LETTER SENT OUT IN AUGUST, OF THE RECONNECT FEE LISTED.

STREET DEPARTMENT-COMMISSIONER SLATER STATED THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO MOVE THE VOTEING POLES FROM TOWN HALL TO THE FIRE HALL. SECOND BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. THREE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION , PRESIDENT GILEFSKI APPEASED. THE STATE OF SHORE BEST POULTRY WAS DISCUSSED. THEY HAVE NOT CONTACTED PRESIDENT GILEFSKI SINCE THE LAST LETTER THAT WAS SENT TO THEM CERTIFIED. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI STATED THAT IT SHOULD BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION ABOUT FINNING THEM A CERTAIN AMOUNT EVERY DAY PER VIOLATION. THE COMMISSIONERS DECIDED TO SENT THEM A TEN DAY LETTER AND IF THERE IS NOT A RESPONSE, THEN THE FINNING WILL BEGIN IMMED.

CITIZEN'S PRIVILEGE-MR. ROYAL GAVE A NOTE TO PRESIDENT GILEFSKI WITH SOME IDEAS FOR THE COMMISSIONERS. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI READ THE NOTE AS FOLLOWS; HE WOULD LIKE FOR THE COMMISSIONERS TO TAKE IT INTO CONSIDERATION TO MAKE BIRCH STREET A ONE WAY STREET, DUE TO IT BEING NARROW AND THE CHILDREN PLAYING. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER TULL TO MAKE BIRCH STREET ONE WAY SOUTH BOUND TOWARD CANNON STREET. SO APPROVED. MR. ROYAL HAS ALSO MADE A SURVEY AS TO LIGHTS BEING INSTALLED AND HE WILL BE HAPPY TO SHOW THE COMMISSIONERS WHERE THEY SHOULD BE. THERE WILL BE A MEETING SCHEDULED. MR. JOHN NICHOLS ASKED ABOUT THE LETTER THAT WAS SENT TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT IN REFERENCE TO THE TRUCK TRAFFIC GOING THROUGH BRIDGEVILLE. THERE HAS NOT BEEN A RESPONSE AT THIS TIME. THE QUESTION WAS RAISED AS TO WHOM IS RUNNING FOR THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS. THERE WILL BE THREE SEATS AVAILABLE FOR ELECTION. IT WILL BE STATED IN THE PAPER AS TO WHO IS RUNNING AND ALSO A NOTICE TO THE CITIZEN'S TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE. THERE WAS A DISCUSSION AS TO WHO CAN AND WHO CAN NOT VOTE IN THE TOWN ELECTION. YOU MUST LIVE WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS. IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT A SURVEYOR BE CALLED TO MARK THE TOWN LIMITS FOR VARIOUS REASONS. DANNY FROM THE IGA STATED THAT THERE IS A PROBLEM WITH THE WATER METER COVER IN FRONT OF THE IGA. IT COULD CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY TO SOMEONE. THE COMMISSIONERS MADE A NOTE TO HAVE THE COVER CHECKED. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO

DISCUSS PERSONEL AND SOME POTENTIAL LEGAL BUSINESS. SECONED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY AT 8:15 PM. THE COMMISSIONERS CAME OUT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION AT 8:50. THERE WAS A MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SLATER TO HIRE PHILLIP MOWBRAY FULL TIME AS OF NOVEMBER 12, 1990 AT THE SAME RATE OF PAY. THERE WAS A MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER TULL TO TAKE THE OFFER FROM THE BALTIMORE TRUST CO. BUILDING.
