

COMMISSIONERS MEETING
OCTOBER 14, 1991
7:00 P.M.

PRESIDENT SLATER OPENED THE MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT WERE MIKE COLLISON, CHARLES ROYAL.

GUESTS PRESENT WERE PHYLIS JONES, SHARON MCDOWELL, GLORIA SCHRECECYST, NEVA MCCLARY, KEN MCILVAIN.

PRESIDENT SLATER FOR APPROVAL OF BILLS, A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER ROYAL AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER COLLISON. APPROVED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER COLLISON AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT TO DISPOSE OF THE READING OF THE MINUTES FROM THE LAST REGULAR MEETING. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT SLATER STATED THE CLEAN UP TOTALS. THE TOTAL TONNAGE WAS FORTY EIGHT TONS OF TRASH HAULED FROM BRIDGEVILLE. WE ARE AWARE THAT THIS SERVICE WAS ABUSED FROM A LOT OF PEOPLE FROM OUT OF TOWN LIMITS. THIS WAS DONE FOR THE TAX PAYERS OF THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE. SIGNS WERE POSTED ON EACH DUMPSTER THAT THERE WOULD HAVE BEEN FINES UP TO \$500.00 FOR DUMPING FROM OUT OF TOWN LIMITS, OR DUMPING ON THE GROUND. THE TOTAL COST WAS \$4,000.00.

KEN MCILVAIN, PHYLIS JONES AND SHARON MCDOWELL WERE GIVEN THE FLOOR. KEN TOLD EVERYONE ABOUT THE STORAGE TANKS. THE TANKS WERE TURNED DOWN 5 TO 1 BY COUNTY COUNCIL. BEFORE BEING BROUGHT UP FOR A VOTE THE PROPOSAL WAS DROPPED. THE STORAGE AREA WILL NOT BE MONITORED LOCALLY, THE MONITOR WILL BE IN DOVER. THERE HAVE BEEN 600 SIGNATURES ON THE PETITIONS. A POSTER WAS SHOWN TO THE PEOPLE AT THE MEETING FROM THE LAST PROPANE BLAST. THE PICTURES ON THE POSTER WERE TAKEN OF HOUSES AND BUSINESSES. THIS BLAST WAS FROM TWO 100 GALLON TANKS. THE TANKS THAT THEY WANT TO INSTALL NORTH OF BRIDGEVILLE WILL BE AT LEAST SIXTY. PHYLIS JONES READ AN ARTICLE TO EVERYONE ABOUT GASOLINE LEAKS AND SPILLS. COMMISSIONER COLLISON TOLD PHYLIS JONES THAT PROPANE DOES NOT CONTAMINATE WATER OR THE GROUND.

HALLOWEEN CURFEW WAS SET FOR 11:00 P.M. FOR ANYONE UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN. TRICK OR TREAT WAS SET FOR 6:00 TO 8:00 P.M. FOR CHILDREN 12 YEARS OF AGE AND YOUNGER. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER COLLISON AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER ROYAL. APPROVED.

PRESIDENT SLATER TOLD EVERYONE ABOUT THE COMPLAINTS FOR LOUD NOISE WITHIN THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE. HE READ THE NOISE

ORDINANCE TO EVERYONE. THIS WAS THE FIRST READING OF THIS ORDINANCE.

COMMISSIONER ROYAL STATED THAT THE TOWN HAS RECEIVED THE NEW TRASH CONTAINERS. THEY WILL BE INSTALLED SOON. ROYAL HAS CONTACTED THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IN REFERENCE TO INSTALLING CROSS WALKS ON MARKET STREET. THE CROSS WALKS WILL BE INSTALLED FIRST, IF THIS DOES NOT HELP WITH THE CITIZENS CROSSING THE STREET THEN THE STATE WILL INSTALL LIGHTS. THE TRAFFIC MUST YIELD TO ALL CROSS WALKS. THE CROSS WALKS WILL BE INSTALLED BY THE BALTIMORE TRUST BANK AND THE IGA STORE ON MARKET STREET. SIGNS WILL ALSO BE INSTALLED STATING PEDESTRIAN CROSSING. ALSO ON CHURCH STREET TO 13A A DOUBLE LINE WILL BE INSTALLED TO INDICATE NO PASSING ZONE.

COMMISSIONER COLLISON STATED THAT WE HAVE A NEW CONSULTING ENGINEER, DAVIS, BOWEN & FRIEDEL FROM SALISBURY, MD. WE HAVE A PROBLEM WITH OUR RBC UNITS AT THE WWT PLANT. IN THE RBC UNIT THERE IS A BUILD UP OF SAND AND OTHER MATERIALS, MOST PLACES HAVE PRIMARY CLARIFIERS IN FRONT OF THE SYSTEM. WE DO NOT HAVE THIS. EVERYTHING IS SETTLING AND THERE IS A SAND PILE-UP. THE UNIT HAD TO BE PUMPED OUT. DAVIS, BOWEN & FRIEDEL WILL BE LOOKING AT THIS PROBLEM AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO CORRECT THIS. ALSO THE FAILING ULTRA VIOLET DISINFECTION SYSTEM, THE TOWN HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH KCI TECHNOLOGIES AND THEY ARE WORKING UP SOME SPECIFICATIONS TO BE SENT OUT TO THREE OR FOUR INDIVIDUAL CONTRACTORS ASKING FOR A FORMAL PROPOSAL FOR REPLACING THE EXISTING ULTRA VIOLET SYSTEM THAT WE HAVE AT THE PLANT. MR. MADORA DID SEND COMMISSIONER COLLISON SOME PRELIMINARY NUMBERS FOR THE REPLACEMENT UNIT ITSELF. THIS FIGURE DOES NOT INCLUDE INSTALLATION. THE FIGURES RANGE FROM \$69,800 TO \$79,000.00. THE SYSTEM WILL COST THE TAX PAYERS OVER \$90,000.00 FOR THE SYSTEM THAT CABE ASSOCIATES RECOMMENDED. COMMISSIONER COLLISON ASKED THE OTHER COMMISSIONERS TO GET IN TOUCH WITH OUR ATTORNEYS ON WHAT LEGAL ACTION WE CAN TAKE AGAINST CABE ASSOCIATES. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER COLLISON AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER ROYAL TO CONTACT THE ATTORNEY IN REFERENCE TO CABE ASSOCIATES. APPROVED.

COMMISSIONER CROCKETT STATED THAT THE MONTH OF SEPT. THE POLICE DEPT. HAD 419 TRAFFIC ARRESTS. THERE WERE 66 COMPLAINTS, WITH 65 OF THOSE CLEARED. A LETTER WAS SENT TO CHIEF ORR FROM JOE BIDEN IN REFERENCE TO THE OPEN HOUSE AND OPENING OF THE NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS. ALSO PRESIDENT SLATER THANKED EVERYONE FOR ATTENDING THE OPEN HOUSE.

MRS. GLORIA SCHRECENYST TOLD THE COMMISSIONERS THAT SHE IS CONCERNED WITH THE WATER PRESSURE ON JOHN STREET WHERE SHE HAS JUST RECENTLY PURCHASED A HOUSE. THE HOUSE WILL BE TURNED INTO A DUPLEX. SHE WAS TOLD THAT A NEW WATER LINE WILL BE INSTALLED. SHE WOULD LIKE TO KNOW THE DATE AS TO WHEN THE LINE WILL BE INSTALLED. PRESIDENT SLATER TOLD HER THAT THE LINE WILL BE RAN, BUT TO CONTACT HIM IN A COUPLE OF WEEKS AS TO THE DATE.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER COLLISON AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER CROCKETT TO ADJOURN. APPROVED.
