

COMMISSIONERS MEETING  
OCTOBER 8, 1990  
7:00 PM

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE WAS BROUGHT TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI AT 7:00 PM. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONERS TULL, WILLEY, SLATER AND EVANS. GUEST PRESENT WERE JOHN LOSCOMB, DOUG JONES, DIANNE WILLEY, PHILLIP MOWBRAY, CHIEF ORR, SGT. OATES, VERA SMACK, MYRNA NEAL, CHUCK BETTS, BEAR BED AND BREAKFAST, BARBARA SHORT, KAY SUE HARDESTY, CHARLES ROYAL, JERRY MARS, AND MILDRED PUSEY.

BILLS WERE PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT, AFTER A SHORT REVIEW BY ALL COMMISSIONERS A MOTION WAS MADE TO PAY ALL BILLS. SO APPROVED.

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI SAID THAT BRIDGEVILLE WILL OBSERVE HALLOWEEN ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 31, 1990 FROM 6:00PM TO 8:00 PM.

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI SAID RAPA AND SHORE BEST HAD SEWER PERMIT VIOLATIONS IN SEPTEMBER 1990. SHORE BEST WAS SENT A LETTER CONCERNING THE PROPER METHOD TO FOLLOW IN REPORTING DATA ON THEIR MONTHLY REPORTS. SHORE BEST HAS UNTILL THE END OF OCTOBER BEFORE THEIR 90 DAYS ARE UP CONCERNING PERMIT COMPLIANCE ON VIOLATIONS THEY WERE PREVIOUSLY NOTIFIED OF.

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS PLEASURE ON THE ENGINEER RECOMMENDATION CONCERNING TWO BIDS RECEIVED TO REPLACE AND/OR OVERHAUL THE COMMINTATORS AT THE SEWER PLANT. A PRICE OF APPROX. \$17,000.00 WAS GIVEN. BOTH ESTIMATES WERE WITHIN \$100.00 OF EACH OTHER. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SLATER TO TABLE ANY FURTHER ACTION ON THE COMMINTATORS FOR THE SEWER PLANT. SO APPROVED.

THE COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE RECEIVED A LETTER FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL IN REFERENCE TO TREE TRIMMING TO MAKE IT SAFER FOR ALL THE CHILDREN WHO RIDE THE BUSES TO SCHOOL. STREET COMMISSIONER SLATER WILL CONTACT ALL PROPERTY OWNERS WHO'S TREES HAVE TO BE TRIMMED.

PRESIDENT GILEFSKI THEN INFORMED THE COMMISSIONERS THAT THE LIBRARY AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT WERE BOTH REQUESTING MONEY. MRS. GASIOR, LIBRARIAN, AND MRS. SHORT, PRESIDENT OF THE LIBRARY BOARD EXPLAINED THAT THE LIBRARY STILL HAS A DEBT OF APPROX. \$14,000. AND THE LIBRARY IS UNDERLOOKING A NEW CAMPAIGE TO PAY OFF THE DEBT. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI TOLD THE COMMISSIONERS MONEY WAS AVAILABLE TO GRANT THE LIBRARY AND FIRE COMPANY REGUESTS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER TULL, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY TO GRANT THE LIBRARY

\$3,000. APPROVED. IT WAS ALSO MOTIONED BY COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI THAT THE COMMISSIONERS WILL LOOK AT MAKING SOME MONEY AVAILABLE TO THE LIBRARY ON AN ANNUAL BASIS. THIS WILL CONSIDERED AT THE TOWNS BUDGET TIME IN FEBRUARY-MARCH OF NEXT YEAR.

THE FIRE COMPANIES REQUEST WAS EXPLAINED BY PRESIDENT GILEFSKI. THE COMPANY IS IN THE MIDST OF IT'S ANNUAL FUND DRIVE. IT HAS REFURBISHED A PUMPER AND COMMITTED TO PURCHASE A NEW RESCUE TRUCK. IN THE SPRING OF THE YEAR THE COMMISSIONERS GAVE THE COMPANY A DONATION TOWARD THE PURCHASE OF A NEW LARGER HOSE WITH THE PROMISE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS LATER IN THE YEAR. SINCE THE REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION BY GILEFSKI, COMMISSIONER SLATER QUESTIONED THE REQUEST ESPECIALLY SINCE IT WAS NOT MADE IN A LETTER TO THE COMMISSIONERS AND NO FIRE CO. OFFICERS WERE NOT PRESENT TO EXPLAIN IT. THE FIRE CO. REQUEST FOR FUNDS WAS NOT ACTED ON.

COMMISSIONER GILEFSKI THEN READ A LETTER FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL REQUESTING HOLDING A BOND FIRE FRIDAY EVENING NOV 16TH FROM 6:45 TO 7:00 PM. IT IS TO BE HELD AT THE CLIFTON STADIUM PRIOR TO THE GAME. MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECONED BY COMMISSIONER WILLEY. APPROVED.

ALDERMAN'S REPORT-PRESENTED AND RECEIVED. COMMISSIONER SLATER THEN STATED THAT HE HAD THE OPPERTUNITY TO SIT IN DURING A TRIAL AND IT WAS HANDLED VERY PROFESSIONALLY BY JUDGE LINGO.

#### POLICE REPORT-COMMISSIONER TULL

WASTE TREATMENT-COMMISSIONER EVANS STATED THAT HE WOULD KLIKE TO WELCOME JOHN LOSCOMB TO THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE AS A RESIDENT. MR. LOSCOMB REDENTLY MOVED INTO TOWN FROM THE COUNTRY. AN ALARM WILL BE INSTALLED INTO HIS DWELLING. THE STATE INSPECTION WILL BE NEXT TUESDAY AND THE PLANT IS READY FOR THAT INSPECTION. COMMISSIONER EVANS THEN COMMENTED ON THE FINE WAY THAT THE MEN AT THE SEWER PLANT HAVE BEEN OPERATING THE PLANT. ALSO THAT IT BE TAKEN INTO CONCDERATION THAT THE TOWN MIGHT WANT TO HIRE A NEW EMPLOYEE TO COMPLETELY SEPERATE THE STREET WORK FROM THE SEWER PLANT. THERE HAS ONLY BEEN ONE BID RECEIVED ON REPAIRING THE GLASS COVERED SLUDGE DRYING BED. THE COMMISSIONERS WANT MORE BIDS TO REPLACE THE GLASS.


WATER REPORT-COMMISSIONER WILLEY STATED THAT WE ARE GETTING CAUGHT UP ON WATER SYSTEM MAINTENANCE. WATER SPECIALTIES HAD A SALE AND WE TOOK ADVANTAGE BY PURCHASING PLUMBING SUPPLIES FOR OUR INVENTORY.

STREET DEPARTMENT- COMMISSIOER SLATER STATED THAT THE FENCE  
AT LAVERTY LANES LOOKS EXCELLENT. PRESIDENT GILEFSKI SAID  
THE HIGHEST POINT IS OVER SIX FEET TALL.

CITIZEN'S PRIVILEGE-MR. MARS ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS TO  
CLARIFY THE DISCUSSION ABOUT THE SEWER PLANT REPAIRS. THERE  
IS A PROBLEM WITH SOME OF THE STORM DRAINS GETTING CLOGGED  
UP DUE TO THE LEAVES. MRS. SMACK STATED THAT SHE WOULD LIKE  
TO THANK THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR WHAT THEY HAVE DONE WITH  
NORTH BRIDGEVILLE. IT IS VERY QUIET AND PEACEFUL NOW.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER SLATER AND SECONDED BY  
COMMISSIONER TULL THAT THERE BE A LETTER SENT TO THE  
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ELIMINATE THE TRUCK TRAFFIC  
THROUGH BRIDGEVILLE.
