COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
SPECIAL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 6, 1972

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 P. M.. Members present were: Mr. Paul A. Lynch, Mr. Allen Jones, Mr. T. J. Gray, Jr.. and Mr. Norman G. Powell.

Guests present were: Mr. John Bryson, Director of the Environmental Division of the State Natural Resources & Environmental Control Commission, and Dr. N. C. Vasuki, Manager of the Water Resources Section.

The following items were presented by Mr. Bryson and Dr. Vasuki for our guidance and consideration;

1. Dr. Vasuki stated that our sewer plant had a rated capacity of 1.2 million gallons per day, but that currently we are operating either close or in excess of capacity. This would reduce the percentage of effluent treated.
2. Dr. Vasuki stated that the fluctuation of the daily ph readings during the summer months were caused by the effluent received by the food processing plants. Listed are the recommendations made to help correct this condition.
 - a. Town ordinance for water and sewer should be enacted as soon as possible. Drafts of recommended ordinance will be submitted by the Environmental Control Division.
 - b. All residences in the town should be connected to the town sewer system. This is in accordance with the original agreement made when the sewer plant was constructed. If residents need financing, this can be obtained from Farm Home Administration.
 - c. It was recommended that steps be taken to reduce private wells within the town limits. It was suggested that an incentive be built into the new water ordinance.
 - d. Any industrial user depositing untreated caustic soda shall be required to neutralize this solution. This can be accomplished by batch treating. This equipment to be installed at the processor's plant and at the processor's cost. Until this can be accomplished, temporary facilities can be installed at the town treatment plant.

- e. It was suggested that a ph meter be installed in the area of the town jail for the measurement of effluent passing that point. Dr. Vasuki stated he may be able to obtain this instrument.
 - f. It was suggested that a recording ph meter should be installed at the town treatment plant.
- 3. Mr. Bryson stated that if the town will send him a letter concerning the new Royster Plant, his department will conduct necessary inspections and issue the resultant permit.
 - 4. Mr. Bryson stated that if the town needs funds for any additions to the treatment plant, 80% financing could be obtained. He believed that if 100% funding was needed for planning, this could be obtained from Mr. Paul Bickford of the Farmers Home Administration, Dover, Delaware.

Meeting adjourned at 8:55.

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
SPECIAL MEETING
MARCH 15, 1972

Meeting was called to order by President Paul A. Lynch at 7:30 P.M.

Members present were, Norman G. Powell, T. J. Gray, Jr., Allen Jones and Earl Willey.

Mr. George Jones, from General Television, Inc. of Rehoboth Beach was also present. He came to talk to the Board about installing cable for T.V. hook-ups in Bridgeville. He is interested in doing this and would like to have plans made and completed before 5/1/72. The Town would receive a one per cent on what was taken in. The installation cost would be \$10.00 and \$5.95 per month, \$1.50 each additional set. As the Board had signed a contract with American Tele-Cast on March 11, 1970, who had not made any effort to start on the installation of Cable T.V. as they had promised shortly after the contract was signed, the Board thought perhaps there would be a way that they could turn this over to Mr. Jones. Our Town Attorney will be consulted on the matter. Mr. Lynch thanked Mr. Jones for coming and he then departed.

There was a discussion on the budget for 1972.

The Commissioners turned in their proposed budgets.


The Police Budget presented by Mr. Gray, Police Commissioner, was received and motion was made by Norman Powell and seconded by Allen Jones that same be accepted.

Earl Willey, Street Commissioner, presented his budget; after some discussion, Norman Powell made a motion that it be accepted. This was seconded by Allen Jones and approved by the Board.

The budget for Waste Treatment was presented by Allen Jones, Sewer Commissioner, which showed a debit of \$7,645.00.

Norman Powell, Water Commissioner presented his budget, but he felt that there should be an increase in water rents of 25% and Allen Jones would have 2 times this increase for use on his budget. Allen Jones made a motion that the Water Budget be accepted. Seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.. The Sewer Budget was accepted by the Board, as they felt the expenditures were necessary. There will be a special meeting Tuesday night at 7:30 P.M. to set the tax rate for 1972 and further discuss budgets.
