ASSAULTS AND BATTERIES

- 501 - The alderman may punish by fine, not exceeding \$100.00 all assaults and batteries, and other breaches of the peace punishable by any law of the Town of Bridgeville, when the offence is not of a high or aggravated nature; provided, that the defendant shall, in writing, submit to his decision; and provided also, that after hearing he shall consider that the case ought not to be submitted to a higher jurisdiction; otherwise he shall commit or bind the defendant for his appearance at the proper court to answer the charge, and shall also bind the witnesses for their appearance and may require surety of them if necessary.

DISTURBERS OF THE PEACE

- 502 - The alderman may cause to be arrested and bind to surety of the peace all affrayers, rioters, breakers and disturbers of the peace, and all who go armed offensively to the terror of the people, or are otherwise disorderly and dangerous.
- (a) - Who ever violates this section for the first offence be fined not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$100.00, or imprisoned not less than 30 days, or both.

CREATING DISTURBANCE IN PUBLIC (DRUNK)

- 503 - Whoever brawls, quarrels, uses abusive, obscene, threatening or profane language in a loud tone of voice, or is intoxicated in or on any public place within the town of Bridgeville, is guilty of disorderly conduct and shall be fined not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$100.00, and in default of fines shall be imprisoned not less than 15 days, nor more than 30 days.

CARRYING CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPON WITHOUT A LICENSE

- 504 - Whoever carries concealed a deadly weapon upon or about his person, other than an ordinary pocket knife (but not to exceed six inches from tip to tip) without a license to do so provided by law of the town of Bridgeville, shall be fined not less than \$25.00, nor more than \$100.00, or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both.

MAKING FALSE COMPLAINT TO POLICE

- 505 - Whoever wilfully and knowingly makes a false complaint to any police officer concerning any crime or accident shall be fined not less than \$25.00, nor more than \$100.00 or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both.

SENDING FALSE FIRE ALARM

- 506 - Whoever wilfully sounds a fire siren, bell or whistle or

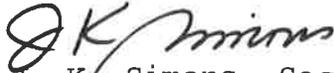

Purpose of meeting is to co-ordinate program of immunization proposed by State Board of Health. Mr. Powell explained program to those present.

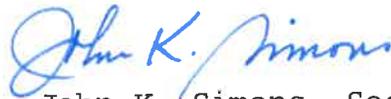

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, The United States government has a vital interest in the development of a national highway transportation system; and

WHEREAS, The State of Delaware government has accepted as its role the development of those highways that will complement the national system; and

WHEREAS, The two-lane highway passing through the Town of Bridgeville, Delaware, known as Delaware Route 404, carries significant volumes of vehicular traffic to warrant present and future highway improvements; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, By the Commissioners of the Town of Bridgeville, Delaware, that the State of Delaware government be asked to consider improvements for Delaware Route 404 in the form of a new highway alignment that will bypass the town limits of Bridgeville, Delaware; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State of Delaware government be asked to seek the necessary revenue to assure that both United States government and State of Delaware government funds be made available to construct and maintain the necessary improvements for Delaware Route 404; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commissioners of the Town of Bridgeville, Delaware, make known to the Governor of the State of Delaware, the members of the Delaware General Assembly, and the Secretary of the Delaware Department of Highways and Transportation by copy of this Resolution, the Town of Bridgeville, Delaware's firm conviction that immediate action is needed by the State of Delaware government in planning those warranted improvements.
