

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
APRIL 14, 1980

Meeting was called to order at 8 P. M. by President Mulvaney.

Commissioners present were: Robert L. Mulvaney, William L. Hartzell, James S. Evans, Walter Gilefski and A. L. Jones. Town Manager, Ronald A. Wilson was in attendance.

Guests present were: Molly Murry of the News Journal and Mr. Joe Pietrowski.

Minutes from last month's meeting were read and accepted as read.

Bills in the amount of \$13,456.91 were presented for payment. Motion was made by William Hartzell and seconded by Al Jones and approved by the board to pay attached bills with one exception, CABE Associates, Inc.'s bill of \$549.45. There was some questions the Board would like for CABE to answer before payment.

Mr. Evans gave a report on the water dept. stating that new water meters had been installed and that 18 more meters had been ordered.

Street Comm., William Hartzell asked the Town Manager, Ron Wilson to write Conrail telling them that Gray's Crossing is in deplorable condition and that even though it is out of the Town's limits he has been approached by many people concerning this and he would like to see this repaired. He would like copy of this letter to go to Mr. McWilliams of the State Highway Dept. He also would like for the State to request Conrail to fix this crossing. Mr. Hartzell would like a copy of the state's letter be sent to him. Mr. Hartzell would like a copy of our grass growth ordinance be sent to Conrail and ask that they comply with same. Mr. Hartzell asked Mr. Wilson to make a survey of grass growth within the town's limits once a week. If ordinance is not being complied with, action deemed necessary by Mr. Wilson will be taken.

President Mulvaney stated he had gotten a good price on a riding mower from General Tractor in the amount of \$1499.00. William Hartzell made a motion to buy mower, seconded by A. L. Jones and unanimously approved by the Board. Charles Burgage is to be trained on operation of this mower and be in charge of same.

Sewer Comm., Walt Gilefski asked why the C.D. being used to purchase this mower was not made known to the Commissioners when the budget for the year was being prepared.

Police Comm., A. L. Jones gave his report of 55 traffic arrests, 57 criminal arrests, 24 criminal complaints, 18 criminal complaints cleared, 29 public assists, 3 accidents, 2355 miles logged and 665 hrs worked. He also commended the policemen on a job well done on the many criminal complaints that the town had encountered in the month of March. Chief of Police, Ron Wilson commended his men on their work during the month of March that resulted in several arrests for numerous burglaries as well as other misconduct. Mr. Jones also stated that interviews had been set up for two policemen on April 15, 1980; 1 full time on CETA and 1 part-time man.

Walter Gilefski, Sewer Comm. reported that an ad had been placed in the News Journal and the Leader for a certified plant operator. Chas. Burbage, our present plant operator, has indicated he will take the certification test again but did not object to the Town hiring a certified operator

because in the event an opportunity arose in the field of drafting he would in all probability take it.

A letter had been received stating that we were in violation of our NPDES permit, a permit we have not had for a year.

Mr. Gilefski also reported that the plant sampling of Rapa shows marked improvement although the PH was low. He feels progress is being made. Within a few weeks meetings will be set up with the industries to implement the user fee. A meeting with Delagra has been set for Monday, April 21st. at 7 P.M. Clark Carbaugh to be present.

President Mulvaney read a letter from the Federal Revenue Sharing stating that they cannot tell us how much money if any, we will receive after our present entitlement period, which ends in Sept., 1980. Public hearings for requests still will be held in the event we do receive more money. The first hearing will be held the second Monday in May (May 12) and the second one will be Tuesday, May 13, 1980 at 7 P. M.


A letter was read from the County telling us that the Town's request for \$2600 was cut to \$1,000. for the current Recreation Fund. They also sent a letter saying if the County did not receive any more revenue sharing money after Sept. 30, 1980 they would not be able to contribute to the Towns.

It was decided to request 9 CETA summer youth employees for the summer; 5 for the street commissioner, 1 for the sewer plant, 1 for tennis, 1 for the water commissioner and 1 for the Town office.

Mr. A. L. Jones made a motion that the monthly meeting hour be changed to 7 P. M. from 8 P. M. This was seconded by William Hartzell and unanimously approved by the Board.

Meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
