

Commissioners Meeting
April 9, 1990

The regular meeting of Commissioners of Bridgeville was brought to order by President Gilefski at 8:00 pm. Present were Commissioners Tull, Slater, Willey and Evans. The pledge of allegiance was then held.

A motion was made by Commissioner Willey, seconded by Commissioner Slater to dispense with the reading of the minutes. So carried. Minutes are readily available for the public's viewing.

FOR APPROVAL:

Bills-After due consideration by each department commissioner, a motion was made by Commissioner Willey, seconded by Commissioner Slater that bills for the month be approved for payment. So approved.

Bond Resolution for the Commissioners of Bridgeville authorizing the Sale of Bond in the amount of \$468,500.00- A meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, April 12, 1990, to sign the final papers on the note to pay off the loan.

After the complete reading of the resolution, a motion was made by Commissioner Slater, seconded by Commissioner Evans, to approve the resolution and the form of the bond as given in Exhibit A, which is an appendix on the resolution. Unanimously carried.

Hunsberger Water Line-President Gilefski informed the rest of the commissioners that Mr. Hunsberger has given a list of additional costs over what the town had promised to pay. Some of the costs involved work beneficial to the town, such as hooking the 10" line into the existing line. After discussion on the matter, a motion was made by Commissioner Slater, seconded by Commissioner Willey to pay only for the sand, stone and concrete used on the job which totals \$585.95. So moved.

Commissioner's Reports:

Commissioner Tull presented written reports to each commissioner for review. During review, President Gilefski interjected that the interviews for Police Chief will be held on Tuesday evening and Wednesday evening. There will be 5 candidates interviewed. Commissioner Tull mentioned that the Town had applied twice for SALLEE funds. The first occasion was for drug enforcement money and the second occasion was for police equipment, etc. Those funds have to be used for equipment only. Commissioner Tull asked for the commissioner's approval for the purchase of a safe for their equipment. Also, Commissioner Tull asked for approval

of a body microphone for drug informants to use. A motion was made by Commissioner Slater, seconded by Commissioner Willey to purchase the gun safe out of SALLEE funds. So moved. A motion was also made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Slater to purchase a body microphone for approximately \$1100.00 (wireless) So moved. Commissioner Tull also spoke to the problem of the leak on South Main Street down from Ellen Russell's house. President Gilefski informed the rest of the commissioners that the leak will be fixed, either by the town or the state.

Sewer Department-The plant employees have built a screening system for the intake water, which is working very well. They are also in the process of working on the UV bulbs at the plant. A decision has not yet been made as to what direction we will go concerning the testing that our plant people should be able to do themselves instead of sub-contracting it. Mr. Loscomb added that the new tests have been added after our permit came out. Joe Gannon will be glad to come down and train our employees.

Water Department-Commissioner Willey stated that there were a few high water bills this last quarter. Adjustments will be made if the owner shows there was a leak and an effort has been made to fix it.

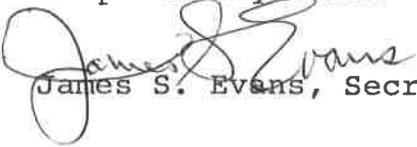
Street Department-Commissioner Slater brought up the prices of trash containers; 3, which will be placed at the softball field, town hall, and the north end of town. Commissioner Slater moved that we rent these on a trial basis of 3 months, seconded by Commissioner Tull. Cost will be \$150.00 per month for three months. So carried.

Also, Commissioner Slater added that he had been approached by Mr. Howard Hardesty concerning new signs at the entrances of town. Mr. Hardesty suggested new locations and asked the commissioners for their backing and participation for this project. Mr. Hardesty has new drawings and will approach the other civic organizations for their financial support. Commissioner Slater will serve as our representative if there is a committee formed.

Citizen's Privilege-Freddie Sylvia asked if there is any way that the hole in front of his residence can be fixed. Mr. Slater will be in contact with Mr. Sylvia as soon as possible. Also, Mr. Sylvia was informed about the problem with abandoned vehicles at his rental property on Walnut Street. He gave his permission to have the town clean it up. Commissioner Tull added that his department is working on the problem.
