Richard I. Lewis made a motion to pay all bills. This was seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.

Mr. Lynch read a letter from Town's Attorney A. Dean Betts, which was a copy of one from Superior Court concerning the Keystone Markets coming to Bridgeville and locating on Market Street. This application had been turned down by the Zoning Officer of the town and a hearing was held later by the Board of Adjustment on this request and it also was rejected. Keystone Markets made

an attempt to take this into court and it was not accepted for a court case.

Mr. Lynch also read a letter from Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control of the State of Delaware concerning our trickling filter, saying that those with mercury seals would have to be replaced by seals of another type. He said that this change would cost around \$4000.00. He asked the Board's opinion as to what they wished to do. A motion was made by Richard Lewis that Mr. Lynch look further into this with the State and see what could be done and if it was really necessary for the town to make such a change. This was seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr. and approved by the Board.

Mr. Lynch read an Ordinance on (Special Stops Required) and after some discussion, the Board thought it should be sent to the Town's Attorney for his comments. After this it will be read again.

Mr. Lynch asked for any reports from the Department. Mr. Gray said that on Delaware Avenue there were places that the Trees were too low and they should be cut to avoid brushing anyone in the face. A suggestion was made that this be taken care of by Mr. Wm. R. Reynolds contacting the Delaware Power & Light Co. to see if they would do it.

Mr. Gray said he felt it was time we had a Chief of Police and he recommended Virgil L. Kinder for the job.

After some discussion Mr. Gray made a motion that Virgil L. Kinder be made Chief of Police at a salary of \$110.00 per week starting the week of the 15th. Richard Lewis seconded this motion that he be on temporary basis until his ability was proven. This was approved by the Board.

Being no further business meeting was adjourned at 10 P. M.
