

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 13, 1971

Meeting was called to order by President Paul A. Lynch at 8:30 P. M. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved. Members present were T. J. Gray, Jr., Earl Willey, Wm. R. Reynolds and Richard I. Lewis. Also present were Chief Virgil L. Kinder and Wm. Coverdale.

Mr. Lynch asked Mr. Coverdale to proceed with the business he came for. He told the Board that the present Sewer Worm for cleaning sewers had worn too bad to be of any use, that the town needed a new one. Mr. Coverdale had been in touch with a company who sold them. The Board asked him to have the representative to come here and explain what the machine could do and also get some prices on same. After this Mr. Coverdale departed.
