

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 14, 1981

Meeting was called to order at 7 P. M. by President Mulvaney. Commissioners present were: Walter Gilefski, A. L. Jones, James Evans and William L. Hartzell

Guests present were: Bonnie Grant of the Leader, Chief of Police, Ricci Pyle, Alderman Margaret Thompson, Mr. Robert Thompson, Mr. Chris Farlow, Mr. Lester Williams, Jr. and Mr. Ralph Collie.

President Mulvaney moved to dispense reading of the minutes, approved by the Board.

Bills in the amount of \$8,872.26 were presented for payment and approved by the Board. Copy of bills here attached.

President Mulvaney read the bids for the storm drain project behind Jeff's Taproom, the Senior Citizen Center and Mrs. Hattie Sylvia. Copy of bids here attached. The low bidder was Swain's Construction Co. for the amount of \$5,075.00. William Hartzell made a motion to accept this bid contingent with the State Highway Department, seconded by Walt Gilefski and approved by the Board.

President Mulvaney then read the bids for the water line running to the new apartment site. The low bids on an 8 inch line from Sierra Construction Co. was \$12,944.60 and a 6 inch line for \$9,802.30 from Sierrra Construction Co. Walter Gilefski made a motion to accept the low bid on the eight inch line by Sierra Construction, seconded by William L. Hartzell and approved by the Board. Other bids attached. Work can begin immediately. Easements between the property owners and the Town of Bridgeville have been drawn up for the storm drain project and are to be signed as soon as possible.

President Mulvaney said that he and Mr. Al Jones had attended a meeting last Friday in Georgetown to set up a task force to bring industry into Bridgeville at the H. P. Cannon site. Mr. Dave Bradon of the State Office Mr. Joseph Conaway of Sussex County Council have given this top priority in Sussex County to sell Cannon Foods as an Industrial Park. Mr. Brandon has set up marketing for Cannon Foods in every state of the country. Hopefully this will bring new industries and employment to the Town of Bridgeville.

President Mulvaney read two letters of intent for Arcades in the Town of Bridgeville. One from James Maddox and one from Donald Donovan. These arcades will be video type arcades. Letters will be sent to these two gentlemen with a copy of the Town's ordinance on gaming and a meeting will be set up to meet with them after the Holidays.

The Board was informed by President Mulvaney that a meeting will be held with Mr. Bob McPheason of Environmental Control and Natural Resources, the Commissioners of Bridgeville and Mr. Clark Carbaugh on January 14, 1982.

President Mulvaney introduced Chris Farlow of Channel 64 to the Board. Mr. Farlow requested permission from the Commissioners to have a key to the Town Hall until sometime in July. He stated that federal regulations required that someone be in attendance as station WDPB was transmitting. Mr. James Evans made a motion to allow Mr. Farlow to have a key to the Town Hall, seconded by Mr. William Hartzell providing he signed for it with Alderman Thompson.

Margaret Thompson, Alderman gave her report for the month. She said that 120 fines were processed in Alderman Court during November, 1981, resulting in \$5,857.80 collected in fines as compared to \$2,923.50 for November, 1980.

President Mulvaney introduced Mr. Lester Williams, Jr. and asked Mr. Williams his reason for coming before the Board. Mr. Williams asked that a street light be erected near his home on Birch St. Commissioner Hartzell will look at the situation with Mr. Williams and give him a reply within 2 weeks.

Mr. Ralph Collie was then introduced by President Mulvaney. Mr. Collie asked if there was some way trucks could be controlled from racing down Church St. He said they speed, drive recklessly and he feared someone is going to be hurt. Police Comm., A. L. Jones said he would look into the situation.

Mr. Evans, Water Commissioner read a report from Don Melson from the State Board of Health about some things that were needed on the various pumps and that the corrosion of the water needs attention. He is to contact Mr. Melson later this week.


Mr. Evans told the Board that Case Edwards is putting in a 3 inch meter at their expense at the apartments and that Delmarva Drilling has found the problem with #3 well. Parts have been ordered and the problem will soon be taken care of. He told the Board he had requested Delmarva Drilling to give him a price on a yearly service contract.

Police Commissioner, Al Jones reported he had ordered a new police car last Saturday from Chamber Motors after receiving 3 bids. He told the Board that the Police had received a letter of praise from Superintendent of Woodbridge School District, Dr. Pressley for the way the police have handled traffic in front of Banks Market and in front of the school. He said there had been 143 traffic arrests, 17 total complaints, 1 accident, 1,754 miles traveled, 179 miles patrolled, 434 hrs. worked, 13 total assists and 381.7 gals. of gasoline used, 295.7 for the police and 86.0 gals. for the waste treatment plant.

Walter Gilefski, Sewer Commissioner told the Board that he had asked for a copy of a complete 201 Facility Plan report before the January 14th meeting. The official 201 Facility Plan Public Hearing will be held at the Woodbridge High School at 7:30 P. M. on the 25th of January.

President Mulvaney adjourned the meeting at 8:10 P. M.
