

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 8, 1980

Meeting was called to order at 7 P. M. by President Mulvaney.

Commissioners present: Robert L. Mulvaney, A. L. Jones, Walter Gilefski and James Evans.

Guests present: Chief Frank Galante, Waste Treatment Plant Mgr. Jack Wozniak, Carol Dongara of the Leader, Jack Simons of Ralph & Paul Adams, Margaret Thompson, Alderman and Mr. Ted Jones of Jones Bros. Dairy Farms, Inc.

Bills in the amount of \$12,747.76 were presented for payment. Board approved payment for attached bills.

Sewer Commissioner, Walter Gilefski read the first reading of the new proposed amendment to the sewer ordinance No. 532 Sec. 7-D relating to the types and amounts of wax, oil, grease and fats which can be discharge into the public sewer system of the Town of Bridgeville. Second reading will be read at the January meeting with the Boards decision at that time.

Mr. Gilefski said he had received in legal form questions and answers compiled for the Delagra suit from Dennis Schrader, Town's attorney. He also stated that Delagra had been paying their bills under the new rate. Mr. Gilefski informed the Board that Jack Wozniak, Waste Treatment Plant Mgr. had attended a seminar in Philadelphia last week sponsored by the Environmental Protection Agency.

President Mulvaney reminded the Board of the upcoming industrial meeting Wednesday night, December 10, at 7 P. M.. He also informed the Board that the suit against the Town by Keel's T. V. was dismissed.

President Mulvaney read a letter to the Board from Revenue Sharing that there is a possibility of funds being cut in 1981 by a substantial margin. He also informed the Board of his meeting with Mr. Drummer of the Case Edward's Apt. Project. He said he was very disappointed in the progress that had been made, seemingly none. Funding by F.H.A. has not been approved at this date. It seems project would not be started for 6 months to a year if funding becomes available. If funding is not approved he feels project will not materialize.

President Mulvaney will be meeting with Lana Williams of the Woodbridge P.T.A. and representatives from the Outdoor Recreation Section of the State of Delaware on Thursday to discuss the Recreation playground Project.

Mr. Evans, Water Commissioner, told the Board that the fire hydrant on First St. had been repaired. He expressed a dsire that in the future, any outside plumbers called in and our town's plumber could be notified of each other's intentions so that they might work in closer harmony. He stated that 15 meters that had been installed are faulty and will be returned and replaced as soon as possible. Mr. Evans made the Board aware that pump No. 1 has been pulled. Because of the age of the pump, parts cannot be found to repair it. Mr. Evans made a motion that because this was of an emergency nature

that a new Worthington Vertical Pump be purchased from Delmarva Drilling immediately for the cost of \$6,017.00. This was seconded by A. L. Jones and approved by the Board with a recommendation by President Mulvaney that the problem of the sand infiltration be solved to eliminate the same problem in the future. Mr. Evans also reported that the driveway at Nellie Rich has been repaired.

Jack Woznaik reported that one-way signs have been installed in back of Jeff's Taproom. There was a discussion again on the parking problem in front of Dr. Burn's office. It was decided to paint the curbing yellow and install no parking from 8 A. M. to 6 P.M. signs. Patients to be encouraged to use town's parking lot.


Police Comm., Al Jones introduced to the Board and Town guests Officer Jeanee Littleton after which he gave the following report:

The murder case of William Hastings has been ~~turn~~ turned over to the State Police. He said that the Town police had traveled 4,098 miles, 283 hrs. patrolled, 967 hrs. worked, 90 assists, 19 complaints and 1 accident for the month of November.

Alderman, Margaret Thompson gave her report. She stated that Det. Ricci Pyle had collected the funds for a number of bad checks issued to various merchants in Town and that the incoming flow of traffic fines has been very good.

President Mulvaney informed the Commissioners of the upcoming Christmas luncheon at the Flagship for the Commissioners and employees.

Being no further business, meeting adjourned at 8 P. M.
