

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
DECEMBER 9, 1974

President Powell called the meeting to order at 7:45 P.M. All Commissioners were present.

President Powell informed the Board that Dulany & Co. will cease operations on December 31, 1974.

President Powell informed the Board that Pet Poultry has again stopped up the sewer lines. Mr. Jones informed the Board that a stick caused the stop up. A certain amount of fat is expected at the treatment plant. Progress is being made on these problems.

Mr. Jones informed the Board that a stainless steel screen will be installed when the repaired pump at the school is replaced on Tuesday, Dec. 10. This is an ordinary repair to facilities. Mr. Shannahan ran tests on well and found that the existing screen has disintegrated below the 100 foot level.

Richardson and Associates submitted a proposal to make analysis of our affluent for the state pollution department. The cost will be \$40.46 per week for this service. Richardson will do this analysis for a short time until our operators can be trained to do these analysis. No action taken at this time.

Mr. Buchanan requests that he be allowed to hold a dance in his pool room. The town has no ordinance to prohibit such a program. The County has a law whereby a permit costing \$150.00 must be obtained. Also two uniformed policemen @ \$7.00 per hour per man are required. No other action taken at this time.

President Powell informed Board that there is no heat in the police interrigration room. Mr. Kial Ewing proposed to install electric forced air unit in room for \$231.00. No action taken here.

Motion made, seconded, and approved that we inform CATV General Corp. of Washington, D. C. and Dan Ross that CATV General Corp. has broken contract signed Dec. 29, 1972, and that contract is being null and void as of this date.

Motion made, second, and approve quarterly adjustment of assessment to correspond with county procedures.

Mr. Jones made report on dilapidated and run down properties. These properties are to be acted upon as soon as possible by the health, fire, and hazards committee.
