

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
FEBRUARY 8, 1971

Meeting called to order by president, Paul A. Lynch at 8:00 P.M.

Members present were Earl C. Willey, Wm. R. Reynolds, T. J. Gray, Jr. and Richard I. Lewis.

Also present were three young people from the Sophmore Class of Woodbridge High School, and Mrs. May Malin and Mrs. Virgie West who live on Delaware Ave. in Bridgeville.

Mr. Lynch asked the young people what he could do for them and they were interested in more trash cans on the streets in Bridgeville and would like to paint them. Mr. Lynch told them the Board would discuss the matter and advise them of their decision. He thanked them for their interest and for coming to the meeting.

Mrs. Malin told the Board that the sewer backed up in her cellar and caused considerable damage. She has a plug in the cellar and it is not known whether the plug was in tight or not and with heavy rain and an overflowed sewer there is a possibility it was loose enough that the flow of the water knocked it out. She asked the Board for something on the cost of getting the heater back in working condition and restoring other articles that were down there. She hired the water pumped out and bought a new motor for the heater.

Mr. Lynch told Mrs. Malin the board would look into the matter and advise her of their decision. Mrs. Malin and Mrs. West then departed. *The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.*

There was a discussion about this matter and it was decided to check with the plumber who pumped out the cellar to get his opinion as to the cause, also cost of the work done.

Motion made by Earl Willey and seconded by Wm. R. Reynolds to pay all bills. Approved by the Board.

Motion was made by Earl Willey to have George McDaniel to print 100 copies of the Town Charter at a cost of \$123.00 and they would sell for \$1.25 to people interested in buying one. This was seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr.

Earl Willey made a motion that we purchase the cans for trash and write a letter to the Sophomore Class visitors of our decision.

Seconded by Wm. R. Reynolds and approved by the Board.

Motion made by Earl Willey that stone be bought for the parking lot next to the Town Office. This was seconded by Wm. Reynolds.

Mr. Willey told the Board about a car that ran into a manhole on Main St. The cover came up and he hit it. At first it was thought the state would take care of this but there was an agreement in 1957 with the town to assume this type of responsibility. The damaged vehicle belonged to a Mr. Gary Davis from Greenwood. His bill will be given to the town's insurance agent, Ralph E. Davis, Inc. for payment.

There was a discussion on enlarging the Sewer Plant to help industry. The town had discussed this with John Stevens from the office of Economic Development, who would give 60% of the

cost and Mr. Peck of Peck-Sussex Co. the other 40% to make the change.

Mr. Lynch asked for reports from the various Commissioners.

Earl Willey asked if someone manufactured their product and sold it, would they have to have a peddler's license. It will be discussed by the Board later.

T. J. Gray, Jr. said he had attended a meeting in Dover, where the Police Departments are planning a central purchasing systems in order to save on cost. It would save the town's money.

Richard Lewis, told of attending the water Seminar of Delmarva Drilling Company, which he said was both interesting and beneficial. A representative of this company has been making checks on the town water system.

Being no further business, meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M.
