

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
RE-ORGANIZATION MEETING
JANUARY 12, 1981

Meeting was called to order at 8 P. M. by temporary chairman, Mildred Brown.

Ballots were distributed to take a vote for President, Treasurer, Alderman and Town Solicitor.

Mr. Mulvaney made appointments as follows:

William L. Hartzell	-	Street Commissioner

A motion was made by Al Jones that all town employees presently working for the town be re-hired. This was seconded by Walter Gilewski and approved by the Board.

Mrs. Thompson, Town Alderman swore in Commissioners and Treasurer.

REGULAR MEETING

Meeting was called to order by President Mulvaney at 8:20 P. M.

Those present were: Mrs. Carol Dongarra from Seaford Leader, Mr. Robert Thompson, Mr. Ted Jones from Rapa, Ralph Lee Scott, Jake Borders, Harold Sheets of Family Ministries, Inc., and a attorney representing Mrs. Mary Herbst from Murdoch and Welsh in Wilmington who came to hear the amendment to Sewer Ordinance No. 532 which has now been adopted.

Mr. James Evans, Secretary, read the minutes of last meeting. Motion made by Al Jones and seconded by Willima Hartzell and approved by the Board to accept minutes as read.

Mr. Mulvaney read bids from J. A. Moore and Sons and Kaye Construction for demolition of the Hattie Sylvia house which was \$3,000.00 for Moore and \$2,874.50 for Kaye Construction. The contract was awarded to Kaye Construction of Seaford, Del. to take down withing thirty days. They will be notified by letter.

Mr. Mulvaney passed the monthly statements and commission bills to the department they belonged.

Mr. Evans made a motion to pay all bills as they were listed. This was approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Mrs. Thompson to work a few hours longer and to set regular hours so the public can be notified.

Mr. Mulvaney asked for reports from the various departments.

Mr. Gilesfski read the second reading of the amendment to Ordinance No. 532. It is now in effect. He also had a letter from Clark Carbaugh about holding a public meeting regarding Pre-Treatment for the Sewer Plant. This notice will be put in two papers.

Mr. Jones, Police Commissioner gave his monthly report for his department. He also told the Board that they were having a lot of trouble with the new police car. It seems that they cannot find what seems to be wrong. It will go back to the shop again as it is now under warranty.

Mr. Hartzell, Street Commissioner said he would like to see the parking lot bumpers at the I.G.A. fastened so they will stay instead of moving closer to sidewalk. He also had some improvements made at Gray's Crossing. This had been done by the help of Senator Adams and County Engineer, Jack Williams. It is an improvement but he plans to go to our Representative and Senator in Washington as Con-Rail does nothing. He would also like to connect to Market St. drainage to take care of all the water in the alley North of Market St., when money is available He wants a letter from Mrs. Sylvia to give him permission to go on her property if he decides to hook on Market St.


Mr. James Evans, Water Commissioner said the new pump has been installed and there was a little more work to do and it would be completed. He also said there has been very little freezing in the lines and no damage at present.

Mr. Mulvaney had a discussion with the Board about purchasing the Johnson property at 200 Delaware Ave. There will be work in cleaning up the lot as it was never finished after the fire. The Johnsons have not yet been contacted about selling it

Mr. Mulvaney said they would have to have a workshop to prepare the Town Budget and he would let them know when they could get together.
