

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
JULY 14, 1980

Meeting called to order at 7 P.M. by President Mulvaney.

Members present were; Robert Mulvaney, A. L. Jones, Walter Gilefski, William Hartzell and James Evans.

Others present were Town Mgr., Ron Wilson, Robert Hayes, Mrs. Carol Dongora of the Seaford Leader, Mr. Robert Thompson and Margaret Thompson, Town Alderman.

Mr. Mulvaney suggested that the Board dispense with the reading of last months minutes and proceed with other business.

Bills totaling \$8,180.46, attached herewith, were presented for payment. After each Commissioner checked the bills in his department, Al Jones made a motion to pay all bills -seconded by Walter Gilefski.

Sewer Commissioner, Walter Gilefski, said Mr. Reinsfelder, who was offered the job as Sewer Plant Manager, had decided to stay at his present place of employment. Mr. Gilefski said he has other applicants that he will be interviewing soon, who are interested in this job.

Mr. Gilefski said he would be talking to Clark Carbaugh on Wednesday and Town Mgr. Ron Wilson will go with him to discuss future plans of operation including sewer usage rates. He will present their findings at the next Board meeting. Mr. Gilefski said there had been other meetings with Mr. Elehwany of Delagra and that an agreeable rate had not been made.

Mr. Hartzell, said he felt that money alone was not the only problem with Delagra, as the over loading of the plant by them would do a great deal of damage and Delagra should make plans to use another way of unloading the heavy load now going to the Waste Treatment Plant.

Police Commissioner, Al Jones gave his report for the month of June as follows: 136 traffic arrests, 7 crimmminal complaints, 1 crimmminal arrest cleared, 3 accidents, 55 public assists, 4,034 miles traveled and 713 hours worked.

He said he has two part-time policemen~~y~~. Also the new car purchased a week ago seemed to be satisfactory. He asked the Board if it would be possible to get radar for the new car, as he felt it was needed. After some discussion Mr. James Evans made a motion that radar be purchased, seconded by William Hartzell and approved by the Board.

Water Commissioner, James Evans told the Board that he had many problems with the pumps and one was going to have to be pulled for repairs. He had contacted Delmarva Drilling about this job but was also going to get in touch with another well company for prices to compare. Ron Wilson, Town Mgr. was to get in touch with Sam Shanahan Artisian Well Co. and report back to Mr. Evans. The Board gave Mr. Evans the go ahead as they were sure it would be much over the \$1,000.00 each Comm. may spend without contacting the Board, as this work would be a must.

Mr. Hartzell, Street Commissioner, read a list of many things he wanted

the Town Manager to see that they were done. It was a general clean up, painting, weeds, patching pot holes, street signs, etc. He wanted the work to start as soon as possible.



Mr. Hartzell read a letter from Ron Wilson who had written to Barry Johnson offering him \$5,800.00 for the purchase of the lot he owns at the Corner of Delaware Ave. and Mechanic Street. The site where his former residence was burned. This can be purchased with HUD money and the thought was clean the lot and make a park with a fountain and benches. Mr. Hartzell made a motion to buy same, seconded by Mr. Evans. After some discussion it was decided that the service contract for our copy machine be accepted and we pay them \$170.00 for the year.

Board retired for executive session.
