

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
July 14, 1986

President Gilefski called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Commissioners present were James S. Evans, William Hartzell, A.L. Jones, Daryl Tull and Walter Gilefski.

Guests present were Alderwoman Connie Collins, Police Chief John Tyndall, Waste Treatment Plant Manager John Loscomb and The Leader reporter Heidi Hickey.

A motion was made by Commissioner Tull and seconded by Comm. Evans to dispense with the reading of last month's minutes. It was approved by the Board.

Bills in the amount of \$19,646.01 were presented for payment. Comm. Evans made a motion to pay all bills as presented, seconded by Comm. Jones and approved by the Board.

President Gilefski gave an up-date on the Adams property. CABE, Associates had not yet given us any figures on the cost of a street or running water, sewer lines to proposed lots. The interested party has now purchased other lots, so there is no immediate urgency to find out these figures.

President Gilefski told the Board that the CDBG for a new well at another site was denied by Secretary West on the fact that DNREC told her it would not be necessary. DNREC told her the well that had been installed in recent months would be back in operation soon. Both Mr. Laverty and President Gilefski feel this is not true. A meeting will be held with DNREC at 10:00 A.M. Thursday. Commissioner Evans and President Gilefski will attend. This meeting will concern Well #4. Pres. Gilefski says he plans to see if there is any way we can recoup our money already spent. Also Pres. Gilefski said he was told that we would have to have a carbon filter installed.

Pres. Gilefski said he has not had a response to his letter to Mr. Ashby concerning our NPDES permit violation, although they have been in contact with our Attorney, Dennis Schrader. No more information at this time.

Pres. Gilefski asked for Dept. Reports:

Alderwoman's report was passed out for review. A copy of report is attached.

Water Department--Comm. Evans said we do not have an ordinance for conservation of water. The State has one that we could change to meet our needs if this becomes necessary. The fire hydrant is off at the Post Office due to a leak under it. Thy hydrant at Hardesty's has a 10" line that would be capable of feeding line for fire company if needed for that block.

The Commissioners decided not to repair the hydrant at the Post Office at this time but also inform the Fire Company of this decision. Comm. Evans also said the hydrant at the Cannon property on Main Street is leaking. There is a possibility that flushing it out will solve the problem. If not, C.O. White will be called. Comm. Evans said he would like a new meter installed at his tenant house and also an adjustment on his bill. He feels the meter is defective.

Street Commissioner Hartzell had nothing to report.

Police Department. Commissioner Jones said there are still a lot of hedges and bushes that need trimming. One in particular is at the old theater building. This has been cut by CETA workers. Comm. Hartzell said to bill the Town. Comm. Jones said that the Cedar Street name sign was not up yet. It is believed that Mr. Laverty ordered the necessary signs needed. Comm. Jones said that we now only have two policemen who are working a lot of over-time. He passed out the guide lines from Sallee if we want to continue to receive funds from them. It concerned rate of pay for policemen.

A letter of commendation was read by Comm. Jones concerning a speeder who was stopped by Patrolman Parsons. He commended him for his courteousness and his approach to the problem. Comm. Jones said he had been receiving complaints about the intersection. Chief Tyndall said the State Highway Department has been notified about the location of the trip. Also DP&L has been notified about the pole on the corner of the Exxon Station. It has been hit several times by trucks. They are looking into moving it back.

Sewer Department--Comm. Tull said he would like to see the Town pick-up truck sold as it is no longer worth fixing up. Motion was made by Comm. Hartzell and seconded by Comm. Evans to advertise for sealed bids on truck. Comm. Jones would like to have it brought back to sewer plant. Comm. Tull said the EPA audit held this past Tuesday on the pretreatment program went fairly well. They were especially interested in two permits issued to Del-Agra and RAPA. They will send their findings and how well we are enforcing their permits. Comm. Tull said that Pet Poultry was operating again. John had taken samples and had it analyzed. The BODs was 4000. Comm. Tull would like to make a motion to send a registered letter that we would not accept their discharge anymore of their industrial waste. The motion was seconded by Comm. Hartzell and approved by the Board. He is also operating his own well. It has a water meter on it. He has been paying on this meter but has cut off front meter. DNREC has given him permit to use well. Comm. Tull said our permit requires us to check and take samples at Del-Agra and RAPA. Del-Agra once a month and RAPA every three months. Enforcement action must be taken to keep them within their permit limits. We will be keeping a tight check on them.

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Comm. Tull said Del-Agra has put in a new flow meter. It has not been certified yet. Comm. Tull said our DMR for the month of June is bad--way over on the BODS. Comm. Tull wrote a letter to the industries for the Commission to review. The State will be in for their audit July 31st. Comm. Tull said they will start to sample random waste from private haulers. They will be charged for sampling.

President Gilefski said he had sent a letter to our Solicitor, Dennis Schrader, with a copy of restrictions to Perdue and Mr. Scott for his review. He also has a copy of the

Mr. Kevin Burdette is to be informed about No. 3 well running.

Comm. Hartzell made a motion to go into executive session, seconded by Comm. Evans at 8:45 P.M.
