

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
JUNE 9 1975

President Powell called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M.

All commissioners are present. Mr. Clark Carbaugh of Edward H. Richardson Associates, Harry G. Farrow, of Harrington Journal, Chief Virgil Kinder, Bryant Richardson of Seaford Leader, Philip Davis, Kyle Ewing, Charles Burbage and Mr. Frank Warren of Delaware State News *attended meeting*.

Philip Davis requests that something be done at his home relative to language and breach of the peace in vicinity of First Street and Gum Alley. President Powell promises action as soon as possible. The Board of Health will be notified about Mr. O. H. Banning properties at the above addresses.

Mr. Carbaugh furnished the payment schedule of payments due Brown Construction for new water tank:

July 31	\$85,216.00 less 10%
August 31	17,662.00 less 10%
September 30	11,601.00 less 10%
October 31	13,860.00 is Retainer

Mr. Carbaugh also discussed possibility of putting trickling filter out of service for repairs. Mr. Carbaugh makes an estimate of \$10,000 to repair the filter. He also discussed the Western Sussex Sewer project. Greenwood would be coming into our sewer plant as recommended by the engineers. Costs would be assumed by Greenwood.

Mr. Charles Burbage requests lots in North Bridgeville be mowed. President Powell promised action on this problem. Mr. Burbage also requests drainage be installed. President Powell informed Mr. Burbage of request to HUD for drainage.

Mr. Kyle Ewing, President of Bridgeville Lions Club, requests the size of building for Hospital Equipment be increased to 15x25 feet. Motion made, seconded and approve the request of Mr. Ewing.

Mr. Kyle Ewing, Chairman of Bi-Centennial Committee informed Board of letter from Federal Bi-Centennial Committee relative to 50/50 funds available. Application has been made for funds from Federal Funds to the state Bi-Centennial Commission. Motion made, seconded and approve funding the Bridgeville Bi-Centennial Committee to the amount of \$500.00.
