

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
MARCH 10, 1980

At 7:30 P. M. the Town Commissioners met to give awards to Mr. Earl C. Willey a retired Town Commissioner and Mrs. Mildred S. Brown, the Town Treasurer, both who have given many years of service to the Town. They were presented with beautiful plaques and Mr. Willey with a retired Commissioner's badge. Coffee and cookies were served.

The regular meeting started at 8 P. M.. Members present were - Mr. Robert L. Mulvaney, Mr. A. L. Jones, Mr. William Hartzell, Mr. James S. Evans and Mr. Walter Gilefski. Town Manager, Ron Wilson also present.

Guests present-Carol Don Garra from the Seaford Leader, Mr. Farrow, from Harrington Journal and Mollie Matthews from the Wilmington Journal, Mr. & Mrs. Della Ferri and Robert Rider, Jr.

Mr. Mulvaney presented a balanced Town Budget for 1980-81. He asked that the Commissioners keep their expenditures within the budget figures. After some discussion, Mr. Al Jones made a motion that the budget be adopted as presented. This was seconded by Mr. James S. Evans and approved by the Board.

Bills amounting to \$6,296.26 were presented for payment. The bills were approved by each Dept. Commissioner and a motion was made by Al Jones that all bills be paid, seconded by James S. Evans and approved by the Board. Bills here attached.

Mr. Mulvaney called for reports from each Department.

Walter Gilefski, Sewer Commissioner reported he and Plant Mgr. Dawson Shahan, Jr. had discussed several small things that were needed for maintenance and he had told him to get them. He also plans to build a shed size 20 x24 which is badly needed for storage.

Mr. Evans, Water Commissioner gave his report. Water receipts were \$1,223.27 and expenses were \$1,692.91. He has ordered 40 new water meters and intends to order more as funds are available.

Mr. Hartzell, Street Commissioner said as money is available he will do work on the streets.

Mr. Al Jones gave his report as follows: Traffic Arrest, 63, criminal arrests, 9, criminal complaints 20, criminal complaints cleared 10, public assists, 41, accidents 2, mileage 2813 and hours worked 637.

Mr. Mulvaney asked for other business and Robert Rider, Jr. told the town that he came as a representative from the Boy Scouts to see in what way the Scouts could help the town in a Community Project. He suggested they had thought of a town clean-up and the Board thought this was a worthwhile thing and the town would give them any assistance they could. Mr. Evans said he had people from North Bridgeville who would like to participate in such a project. For further plans on this they are to contact our Town Manager.

Mr. Mulvaney read a letter from State of Delaware Dept. of Natural Resources and Environmental Control-Division of Environmental Control Section, saying that the Town is in violation and not in compliance with its NPDES Permit No. DE0020249.

Mr. Mulvaney said there will be a meeting called with RAPA Scrapple on March 24 at 7 P. M. and he would like all members present. Hopeful something can be accomplished.

There was a discussion on a Consultant for the Sewer Plant and it was decided that CABE Associates be our Engineers. Motion was made by Al Jones and seconded by William Hartzell and approved by the Board that we use their services.

(A motion was made by William Hartzell that the Commissioner of Bridgeville support the School's Referendum on March 25, 1980. This was seconded by Mr. James Evans and approved by the board.


