

Commissioners of Bridgeville
Regular Meeting
March 12, 1990

The regular meeting of the Commissioners of Bridgeville was brought to order by President Gilefski at 7:00 pm. Commissioners present were Lance Willey, Bob Slater, Walt Gilefski, and Jim Evans.

Guests present were: Kathy Lingo, new alderman; Leroy Truitt; Dianne Willey; Walter Mars; Charles Royal; Gene Crockett; Glenda Crockett; Bob Scoglietti; Steven Heder; Pamela Rizzo; Albert Rizzo; and Ed Curlett from the Salisbury Times.

First order of business was the reading of the minutes from the last regular meeting and the February special meeting. Commissioner Evans then read the regular meeting minutes. A motion was made by Commissioner Willey, seconded by Commissioner Slater to dispense with the reading of the special meeting's meeting. So moved.

President Gilefski then recognized Kathy Lingo, who will be our new town alderperson.

Update on FmHA Loan, Grant and Repayment - President Gilefski anticipates a meeting, in the near future, with the loan bondsman and our solicitor. All the necessary paperwork has been satisfied with FmHA.

FY 1990-1991 - Several workshops were held during February on the budget. After discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Slater to approve the budget as presented for the forthcoming year. So approved.

Pre-treatment Consulting Agreement-President Gilefski enlightened the commissioners and guests on the agreement. A motion was made by Commissioner Willey, seconded by Commissioner Evans to approve the agreement with CABA Associates. So moved.

President Gilefski then talked about the new water quality standards set forth by DNREC and his disapproval of same. President Gilefski added that he only received the standards one day before they were announced to the public. These standards will restrict much more the effluent that we will dump into the waterways, drastically changing our procedures and permit. An appeal will be drafted by a group who will represent the industries, municipalities, and Kent County. After much discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Slater, seconded by Commissioner Willey to pay the \$1000 and join the appeal of the water quality standards

as submitted.

Commissioner's Reports:

Police Report-Commissioner Tull is ill but a copy of the police report is included in each commissioners papers.

Sewer Report-Commissioner Evans reported that Debbie Eason from the FmHA toured the treatment plant last week and seemed to be impressed with our operation. No violations were reported during the month of February. One of the RBC shafts is currently broken, and will be taken care of by the manufacturer, as it is still under warranty.

Water Report-Commissioner Willey had no report at this time.

Street Report-Commissioner Slater reported that he has checked into the state-owned street sweeper and at this time it is broken down and waiting for parts.

Alderman's Report-Mrs. Thompson has given a copy of her report to each commissioner.

Citizen's Privilege- Mr. Truitt asked if he could possibly get a one-inch water line to his property. Also, he would like the whole in the sidewalk adjacent to his property be taken care of. He also would like to know where our drug dog is and when we will get it back. President Gilefski stated that we are working with Mr. Tyndall's lawyer in obtaining the dog as soon as possible. Another question by Mr. Truitt was concerning the housing at Laverty Lanes and whether they were in town limits. President Gilefski stated that most of them are, but the community center is not. Commissioner Willey will get with Doug concerning the new meter and the whole in the sidewalk.

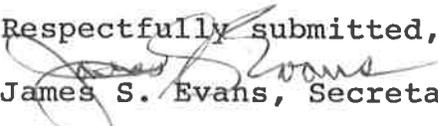
