

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
March 9, 1981

Meeting called to order at 7 P. M. Members present were Robert Mulvaney, Al Jones, Walter Gilefski, James Evans and William Hartzell.

Other guest were Jack Wozniak, Waste Treatment Plant Manager, Margaret Thompson, Town Alderman, Nelson Cannon, Francis Lewis, David Speicher, Ralph Davis, Leon Lippert, Arthur Handley, Harry Short and Chief of Police, Frank Galante.

Mr. Hartzell made a motion to dispense of the reading of last months minutes; Mr. Gilefski second this motion.

Motion was made by Walter Gilefski to pay all bills after each Commissioner approved his department expenditures. This was seconded by William Hartzell and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked for Commissioners reports.

Mr. James Evans said he was concerned with the electrical operating of the pumps and would like to get some work done to them so they would be more efficient. He also plans a meeting with people outside of Town limits who have town water.

Mr. William Hartzell said he had not received any response from letters he had previously written to get improvements made to Gray's Crossing.

Mr. Al Jones gave the police report for the month.

Mr. Walter Gilefski gave his report as Sewer Commissioner. He read a letter from Pet Poultry that they had shut down but we are still showing a usage of around 6900 gals. per day. At present he has not heard from Town's attorney concerning Richardson's Associates who previously worked on 201 Facility Program and we would now like to change everything to CABA Associates. He plans to contact Mr. Schrader shortly.

Mrs. Thompson, Town Alderman gave her monthly report.

Mr. Mulvaney read the proposed budget for 1981 which amounted to Receipts of \$341,931.23 and Disbursements of \$325,310.00. He explained each departments needs and cuts that had to be made to meet this. High inflation that we are now in is a big factor for this raise.

We had several comments from our visitors .

Mr. Mulvaney said they are planning for outside help from CETA who previously gave us a big lift. Other government help will be down as to what extent, we do not know. Mr. Mulvaney told of his trip to Washington and how he benefited from it. He said that there was a bleak outlook for future outside help.

Our new tax rate will be an increase of \$.30 per hundred. 15¢ will be on general operation and 15¢ on sewer plant operation.

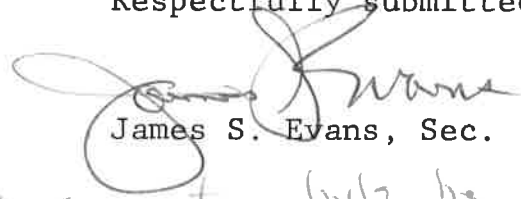
Mr. David Speicher asked if the Town could have a garbage pick-up

Mr. Mulvaney answered questions from the floor and after his Mr. Gilefski made a motion that the proposed budget be adopted with the increase in taxes as stated. Mr. Al Jones seconded this motion. This was approved by entire Board.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 P. M. Board went into executive session.
