

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
MAY 12, 1980

Meeting called to order at 7 P. M.

Members present were, Mr. Robert Mulvaney, Mr. A. L. Jones and Mr. Walter Gilefski.

Also Mr. Charles Sorrells, T. J. Gray, Jr., Howard Hardesty, Robert Rider, Jr., Daryl Tull and Molly Murry of the News Journal were present.

Mr. Mulvaney, asked if there was anything on Revenue Sharing which had been advertised to the general public. The Bridgeville Historical Society and The Fire Company made requests for money. Mr. Mulvaney told those who were here for donations that their request would be considered and they would be notified at a later date of the Board's decision.

Mr. Mulvaney read a letter of resignation from Virgil L. Kinder who was Alderman of the town for several years. Walter Gilefski made a motion that we accept Mr. Kinder's resignation. Al Jones seconded this motion. The vote was two to one for acceptance.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Sewer Commissioner, Walter Gilefski for a report on Waste Treatment activity and Mr. Gilefski said he would be more prepared at a later date to present his report.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Police Commissioner for his report. Mr. Jones gave the following report: 106 traffic arrests, 27 criminal arrests, 11 criminal complaints, 7 criminal complaints cleared, 60 public assists, 2 accidents, 3064 miles traveled and 661 hours worked.

There was a discussion on personnel policy of hiring people for town work. Mr. Mulvaney made a motion that anyone needing extra help in their department should do his own interviewing and then report his findings to the Board.

Mr. Ron Wilson told the Board what had been planned for town clean-up day which was a Boy Scout Project and he would be over-seeing the job.

Mr. Al Jones said he would attend the Sussex County Prayer breakfast which was to be held on Tuesday, May 27 at 7:50 A. M.

Mr. Mulvaney said due to increased cost of electricity for heat and air conditioning we will try to keep our business operation on first floor.

Bills totaling \$8,826.61 were presented for payment. Motion was made by Al Jones to pay all bills, seconded by Walter Gilefski and approved by the Board. Bills here attached.

Ron Wilson said a new police car had been ordered. There were four bids received for the purchase of the car.

Being no further business, meeting adjourned at 9 P. M..

\* I make a motion to charge the industrial users \* of the sewer systems of the Town of Bridgeville the following rates:

- A. For fixed operation and maintenance a charge of \$0.17/1,000 gal
- B. For variable operation and maintenance a charge of  
\$0.16/1,000 gals. for normal strength waste (less than 250 mg/l)  
\$0.41/1,000 gals. for high strength waste (250-500 mg/l)

and for excessive strength waste (greater than 500 mg/l) the rate of \$0.41/1,000 gals. to be increased by the ratio of measured waste strength to 500 mg/l.

If waste strength exceeds 1,000 mg/l the discharger is subject to enforcement action under the Town's ordinance.

- C. Hydraulic Load (amount of discharge)

For normal waste flows the above mentioned fixed operation and maintenance rate of \$0.17/1,000 gals.

For high waste flow (700,000 gpd to 850,000 gpd) a rate of  $(1.25 \times 0.17)/1,000$  gals.

For excessive waste flow (greater than 850,000 gpd) enforcement action under the Town's ordinance.
