

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
MAY 13, 1974

President Powell called meeting to order at 8:00 P.M.

Commissioners Jones, Gray and Simons were present.

Minutes of meeting of April 8 were read and approved as read.

President Powell presented pool room problem to board. The Commissioners feel that the 1909 ordinance should be enforced. Mr. Gray moves that the Town Solicitor draw an ordinance that all establishments catering or entertaining juveniles shall be closed at 9: 00 P.M. prevailing time. Establishments who's closing time is governed by state liquor laws will close in accordance with said laws. All other pool hall establishments will be closed at midnight and all establishments will be closed on Sunday. Motion seconded by Mr. Simons. Motion carried. Letter from solicitor attached to these minutes concerning ordinance.

Mr. Clark Carbaugh reported to board progress on public projects. Mr. Carbaugh requests approval of location of water tank per letter of April 18, 1974, which is attached to these minutes. Mr. Carbaugh also explained proposed operational changes at sewer treatment plant to increase efficiency of plant and reduce odor, etc.

Mr. Dennis L. Schrader, solicitor, attended meeting. Mr. Schrader had questions concerning delinquent taxes, water and sewer bills.

Mr. Powell reports CATV is held up because of FCC non approval as of May 10 because of General Telephone protest.

Motion made, seconded and approved to construct storm sewer from Laws St. to Cannon St. for sum of \$12,600.00 on Del. Ave.

Mr. Powell requests that Commissioner Simons investigate needs for storm drains on Del. Ave. from Laws to Williams Sts.

Mr. Powell read letter from University of Delaware relative to community improvement projects. No action was taken.

Motion made, seconded and approved that retired policemen be given their badge, case and I.D. card upon retirement.

Motion made, seconded and approved to have trees behind office removed by Johnson Tree Service Co. for \$350.00.

Alderman reports fines totaling \$4,803.00 for April 1974.

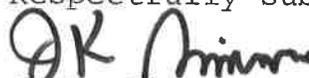
